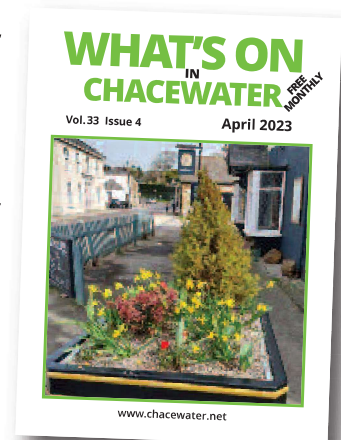

# CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY WALKING (CROW) GROUP

**SUNDAY 5<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2023)**

Greeted by a brisk and slightly overcast morning, the first Sunday in March CRow walk saw a continuance of an early 2023 theme of visiting most parts of the Parish Public Rights of Way (PRoW) throughout the coming year which, on this occasion, meant a trek south and slightly east along mostly minor roadways, up and down various vales!

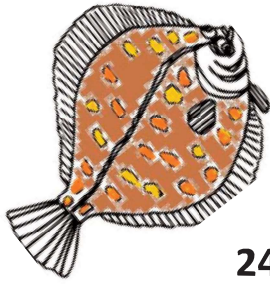


17 winterly dressed folk and our 4-legged friends (Skipper and Louis) set off down the Twelveheads Road in good spirits and after about 15 minutes turned left onto and up along Footpath 70/1. This particular PRoW takes you up by “Silverwinds” and “Riverside”, beside Wheal Prosper Farm and on towards Rose and Highview Farms. At first, it is quite steep, uneven and well gouged from years of surface water erosion. However, it eventually levels out and a combination of works undertaken by some new local residents and

Cormac’s Countryside Access Team sees the surface conditions improve quite significantly, until it levels out completely and you eventually emerge on to the main Chacewater to Bissoe roadway. A good bit of exercise early on then; it pays sometimes to pause for breath here and there (*as we did!*) and turn to take in some stunning views westward across the steep-sided Carnon valley to the line of Creegbrowse ridge road running down into Twelveheads, which is seen in the background of the Team photo here.

We re-grouped at the top of Footpath 70/1 before turning right along the fast-moving and busy road to Bissoe. Keeping our wits about us, we went just about 100 yards before picking up a well signposted Bridleway (71/1) on the right, which currently advises you

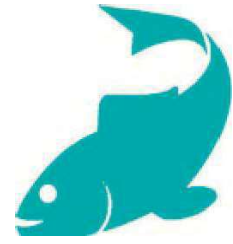

of works going on in the area. The works in question include various mini mountains of rubble and the access point to the Cornish Lithium exploration drilling site, which was active on the day and became a source of much discussion as we passed by. We continued down this steepish and well-covered Bridleway which ultimately brings you back onto the Twelveheads road over the footbridge near Willow Bridge Cottage, where we paused for a second photo opportunity.

With time moving on, we headed back up the road towards the village while some of the group took a slight detour left up the very steep but lovely little



cut-through Footpath 40/1, which connects with the lane just above Wheal Harmony Cottage and near where we met a couple of curious bullocks. Still full of chat, the final leg of our journey took us back into the village via the Twelveheads road once more, eventually arriving near the main Square Car Park just after 1100.

**Another enjoyable trek complete, the next CRoW walk departs the Square Car Park at 0930 on Sunday the 2<sup>nd</sup> April - it's just healthy, enjoyable and anyone is welcome!**

## CHACEWATER VILLAGE HALL AGM

Last month the trustees and committee held their Annual General Meeting to review the past year and plan for the next.

The annual report highlighted the introduction of Hallmaster (an online booking system) This enables customers to check when rooms are free and book the hall themselves. It is also easier to administer than the previous system we had.

Our annual maintenance programme ensures that the hall always looks good and provides a pleasant environment for the people who use it. The remodelled kitchen has proved very successful giving space for more than one group to share the facility or making it easier to cater for larger functions.

During the year we have undertaken to replace or upgrade our lighting units to LEDs in a move to keep energy costs as low as possible, we will continue to look at other areas as we try to minimise our energy use and reduce our carbon footprint.

The fluctuating cost of energy is an ongoing concern for us but, with a warmer time of year ahead, it was decided to **keep hiring costs as they are for the moment**. This will be reviewed regularly through the year as prices settle down and we will see if changes are needed for next winter.

There will however be an increase in the caretaking charge to reflect the

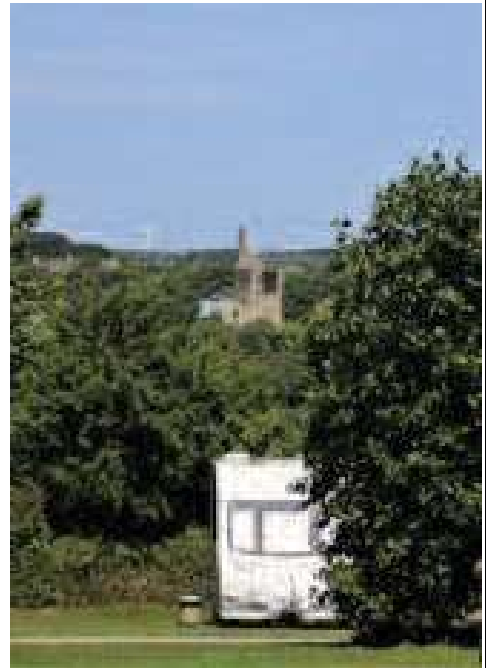

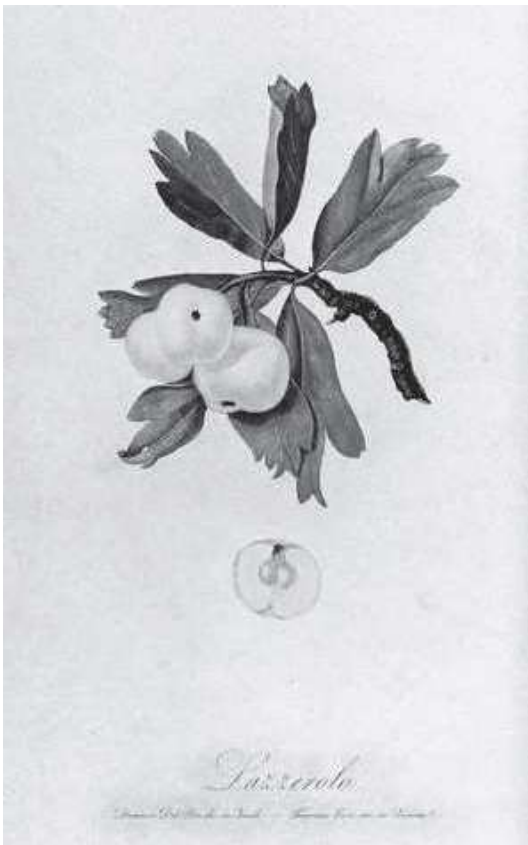

# CONVERSATIONS FROM THE SHED

There are lots of UK grown crops that if given the right conditions can be stored for use in winter and early spring. A bed of dry sand will keep root crops like parsnips and carrots fresh, and careful curing of garlic, onions, squash and pumpkins can ensure a supply throughout the colder months. If you're lucky enough to have a supply of apples and pears several varieties such as Bramley, Granny Smith and Braeburn apples; Conference and Doyenne de Comice pears among others can be stored in cold but frost free, and well-ventilated conditions.

What could be more comforting on a chilly damp day than a heart-warming apple crumble! So, here's our apple crumble recipe to serve 6:



Start by making your crumble topping by mixing 6oz (170g) plain flour, 2oz (60g) porridge oats, 4oz (115g) margarine or butter and 3oz (85g) of caster sugar until you have a nice crumbly texture. At this point you can tweak the recipe to suit your own taste, why not add finely grated zest of a lemon or orange, a teaspoon of cinnamon or a handful of chopped nuts or raisins.

You'll then want to fill an oven proof dish with roughly chopped apples (with or without skin as you prefer). You'll need about 1 large apple per person. Don't worry about chopping all your fruit to the same size, having a mixture of sizes will add texture and bite to your dish. Then sprinkle over 1 tablespoon of sugar – using a brown sugar will give a more interesting, caramelised flavour. Pour about 50ml of liquid over your fruit – you can use water, or fruit juice for additional flavour. Then squash your fruit mixture into the dish and top with crumble topping to about 2cm depth. Any remaining crumble topping can be frozen for later use. Pop your dish in the oven for 30 to 40 minutes at 180C, until the mix is bubbling and the topping browning. Then serve with cream, crème fraiche, or ice-cream and enjoy!

The community garden isn't yet able to supply apples, however we've now got 13 fruit trees planted! So (fingers crossed) there will be plenty available in the years to come. If you haven't been up to the garden in recent months, we'd recommend a visit as there have been a lot of changes. On

the upper terrace you'll now find an orchard and wildflower meadow on the eastern end, and a stumpery at the far western end. For those of you who are unfamiliar with stumperies - these were once popular in the Victorian era but are coming back into fashion as people learn to appreciate the importance of leaving deadwood for biodiversity reasons and they are a perfect way to display and appreciate the smaller plants such as ferns, snowdrops and mosses.

By the time you read this we hope to have finished preparing and fencing a large area for cut flowers, herbs, and edible flowers, which also includes a greenhouse (a bargain from Helen Dyer) and a cold frame (kindly donated by Pam Hawke of Crofthandy). The slabs which make up the new flight of steps and decorative elements around the greenhouse were also donated by Kathie and Steve Ford. So, a huge thank you to all these generous people. The lower terrace will once again mainly be used for growing produce, and we're trying out some 'No dig' beds for the first time.

Please remember the garden is yours, and always open to you. 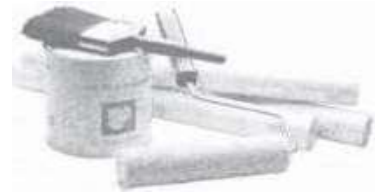

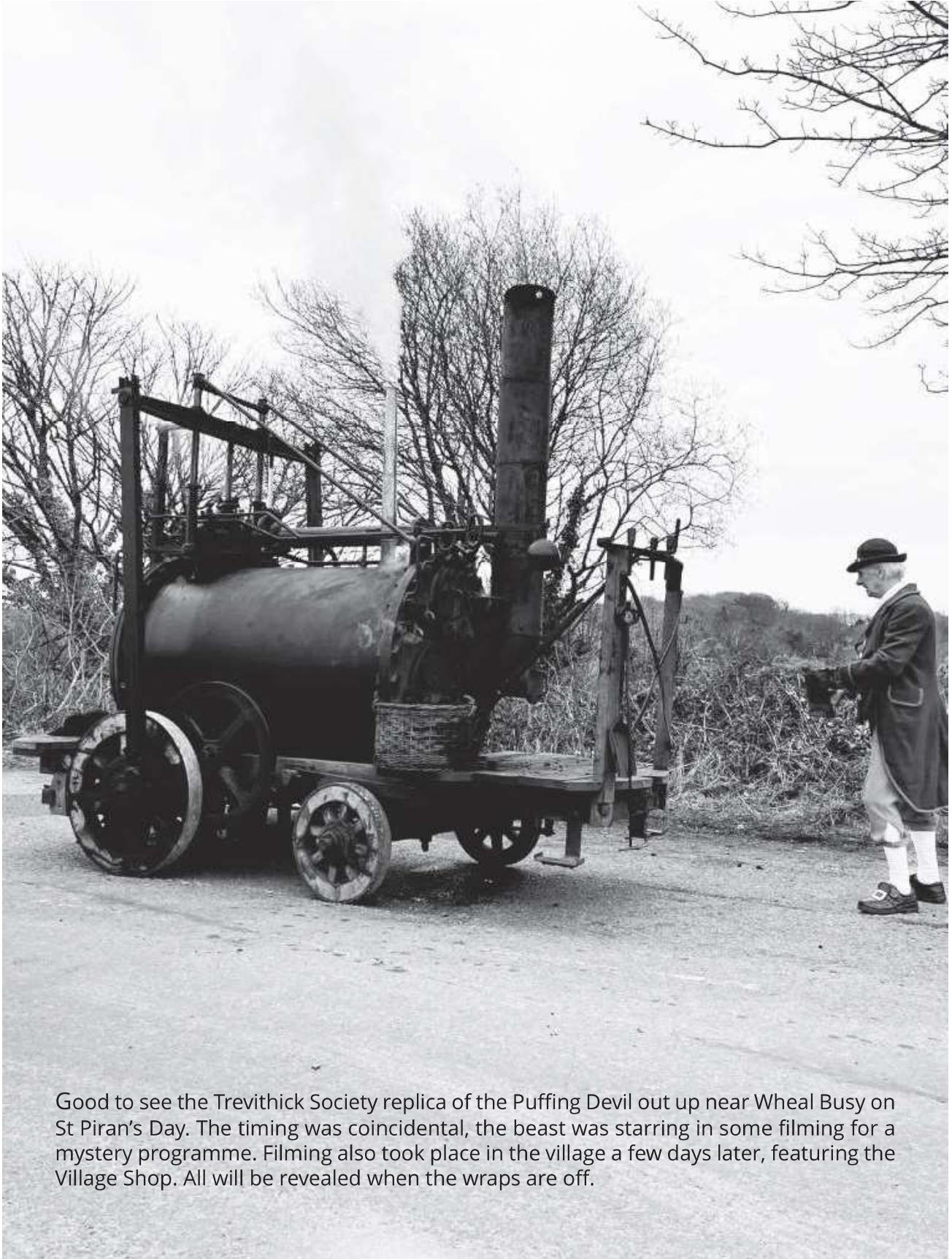
'The wheel' traversing western skies over Wheal Busy. This image brings together different aspects of searching the skies from the ground and searching the ground from the sky.

and several being re-commissioned. Hymns were sung and there were readings and reflections. It was a lovely service, made all the better by a full cathedral and the singing was wonderful! My many friends at St Paul's have been wonderfully supportive and encouraging and I thank them wholeheartedly for all their love and support."*

The congregation were invited to bring along photos of Mums who were no longer with us. We had readings and poems and sang lovely hymns. There were tears but also laughter on this special day. ## **DEATH OF CAPT. T. GRIBBLE - METHODISM'S LOSS**

### **Largely Attended Funeral At Chacewater**

Methodism in Cornwall suffered a severe loss in the death, on Saturday, of Captain Tobias Gribble, at his home, Estrella, Chacewater. Capt. Gribble, who had been a local preacher for 56 years, was one of the best-known Methodist lay figures in West and Mid Cornwall, and he preached well over 2,000 sermons. Two days before his death, he presided at the Daffodil Day rally at Camborne Centenary Methodist Church.

Captain Gribble, who was 79, had a distinguished mining career. Born at Creegbrowse, Chacewater, he began working at Killifreth Mine when he was only 14, and after going to Dolcoath, he took his first mining appointment abroad in 1899 on the West Coast of Africa. He returned to Cornwall to marry Miss Catherine Skewes, of Tuckingmill, and then went to Chile, where he spent five years in copper mines, becoming mine manager at the age of 26.

Later, he spent three years tin mining in Bolivia, and four years in the Malay States, before going to Portugal, where

he stayed for 20 years. He retired to reside in Chacewater in 1934, but remained a consulting engineer for the Beralt Tin and Wolfram Mine.

### **CLIGGA MINE**

Shortly before the war he was instrumental in opening Cligga Mine, at Perranporth, a mine which produced vital tin and wolfram through the war years. In 1951, Capt. and Mrs. Gribble returned to Portugal for a holiday at the invitation of his old mining firm. Two years earlier, they visited a daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. R. Colliver, in Ontario, Canada.

Religion was the over-riding interest in Capt. Gribble's life. He preached his first sermon at Illogan Highway in February, 1899, and completed 2,000 sermons in 1951. A gifted speaker, at many churches he preached at special services for as many as 15 years in succession.

His own church was Station Road Methodist Church, Chacewater, of which he was a trustee. For many years he was chapel steward and trust treasurer, and one of his most prized possessions was an illuminated address presented to him by members and friends in recognition of his service to the church. A prominent member of Truro St. George's Circuit, of which he was an ex-circuit steward, Capt. Gribble was a familiar figure in the District Synod, having been lay secretary for temperance and social welfare.

# PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY AND TRAILS

**Local Maintenance Plan (LMP).** The contract for trimming selected Byways, Bridleways and Footpaths has been agreed and so Mark Woodley will be out and about once again over the coming months, giving some of our 160 odd PRow a good trim.....but only where it is deemed necessary so to do, because we do need to consider keeping our wildlife habitat in good order!

**Enhanced Local Maintenance Plan (ELMP)** works to reinforce the side and make a surface water gully along the Byway 301/55/2 (near Salem Chapel) are now all but complete and so (hopefully with Tregothnan Estate's permission, fingers crossed) we move our ELMP operation over to Bridleway 301/61/1, at the western side of Wheal Busy. This area has suffered from "pooling" for many years now. We have the resource and funding and so just need that Tregothnan nod!

**Illegal Use of PRow/Trails by motorised vehicles Group re-established.** Recent months have witnessed some of the worst illegal off-road motorised vehicle activity seen around the Parish for many a year, with the Todpool/Poldice Valley area being particularly hard hit by unauthorised groups of 4 x 4 vehicles. The damage done to vital parts of the World Heritage Site (WHS) and surrounding landscape has been significant and seen key areas of fencing destroyed, water courses disrupted and other, more legitimate

users of the Coast-to-Coast (C2C) Mineral Tramway, put in danger – thank goodness for good parenting and the awareness of horse riders on occasion!

Something had to be done and so in view of what had been reported, it was decided to re-form the 'Illegal Use of PRow/Trails by motorised vehicles' group, which last met over 3 years ago. An open forum was convened over at Gwennap Parish Rooms on Thursday the 23<sup>rd</sup> February and saw 23 representatives from 4 other surrounding parishes, the Poldice Valley Trust, concerned local residents as well as D&C Police. Pictures and video evidence was shown and Actions formally minuted, a key focus being to see if we can link with legitimate 4 x 4 or 2 x 2 off-road groups in the hope that they can help target offenders. Time will tell if we get anywhere here, but it won't be for the want of trying!

In terms of balancing the argument, we do need to be reminded that most off-road vehicle users are very conscientious, law-abiding folk and so we find ourselves once again having to deal with the minority of individuals who simply either don't care or need educating in terms of the damage they are causing. # VILLAGE PONDWATCH

## March 2023

It remained dry in the last week of February as the water level continued to go down in the pond. In the morning three toads lifted their snouts above the surface, there was a short scuffle and splashing across the weeds. Later, in the sunshine, a solitary male toad appears under water. He stumbles slowly over heaps of dead leaves that litter the floor of the pond, then sits still for a while and stares at the sky. At last, he turns and makes his way back towards deeper water and disappears into a forest of green stalks. Briefly, a small water beetle bobbles about just below the surface.

On 26<sup>th</sup> February a small cluster of frog spawn drifts at the edge of the weed bank near the east shore.



The morning air is very cold and clear ice covers the surface – revealing the pond's contents in crisp detail.

The cold weather gives way to rain in March, which begins to top up the water level. There's a brown backdrop of vegetation around the pond, but bursts of bright colour signal spring is on the way. Beneath the ravaged tufts of bulrush, marsh marigolds make mounds of lemon yellow flowers. Dandelions and some lesser celandine flowers match this yellow on the bank,

next to a little clump of miniature jonquil daffodils.

A pair of Green woodpeckers forages on the ground in the Green.



Disturbed, they take a low, undulating, flight into the trees behind the storage shed. Brambles beside the pond are sprouting fresh green shoots and the willow bush has furry buds along its branches.



A wide variety of small birds frequent this hedgerow along with the resident blackbirds and sparrows. A female goldcrest lands in the bush beside a bluetit. Showing a bright yellow-on-black Mohican stripe, the tiny bird drops to the water and bathes vigorously. She is followed by a flock of goldfinches washing gaudy flashes of red, yellow, black and white. Meanwhile, two coal tits, with black-striped head and white cheeks, examine the willow branches carefully.

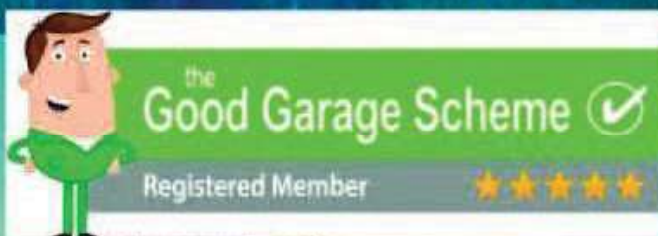
