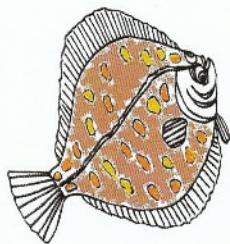



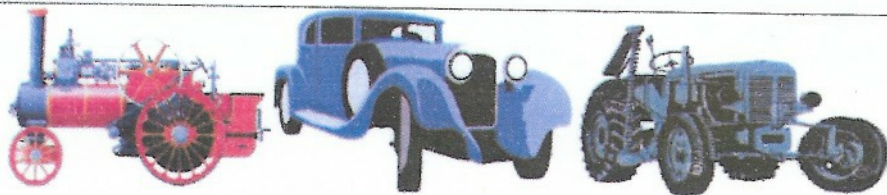


Rocking Chacewater Bowling Club!

CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY (CROW) WALK

SUNDAY 1st JULY 2018

There we all were talking about and enjoying the heatwave towards the end of June/early July - which would have tested even the most hardened walker - when the clouds opened up (in a nice way!) to greet the 10 members of the CRoW for the first Sunday walk in July. The group looked fit and up for a goodly trek and this was certainly achieved as we aimed to explore more of the far-reaching parts of our glorious landscape.

So, off we went via Station Road, The Terrace and up along Wheal Busy Lane, past the Old Smithy at which point we turned right towards Duckworth's, then left on Bridleway 301/60/2 and straight along Byway 301/2/4 to the back of Boscawen Farm. Noting some Japanese Knotweed near the entrance, this particular bridleway is historically quite significant for another reason in that it has a white stoned surface which, in times of yore, helped miners navigate their way to and from their workplace. Continuing along and joining Bridleway 301/2/3, we eventually came out near the entrance to the Hallenbeagle Bio Park, which we navigated round via Bridleway 301/59/1 and then down along Sawmills Lane (301/57/2).

Following a short brief on the long-term drainage problems and associated solutions from locals Richard Sexton and Dave Sutton, we set off once more across the Falmouth Road crossing at Scorrier at which point where Paul Shevlin wisely suggested we head back through the magnificent woods on Footpath 301/14/2, which eventually connect the Killifreth Mine area along 301/15/1 and 301/16/2.



Did J R Tolkien get his ideas for his trees in Lord of the Rings here? Inside the woods along Footpath 301/14/2 near Falmouth crossing Scorrier - those who cycle along the Portreath to Devoran tramway would miss this magical place!

We left the Killifreth area and headed back into Chacewater village across the road and down onto Wheal Busy along 301/1/11 and 301/1/9 before meeting Wheal Busy Lane once more. It really is such a shame that some people see this place as little more than a dumping ground for their unwanted rubbish (all of which could legitimately be taken to United Downs?) because in all other respects it is fabulous place that can be enjoyed by many locals and visitors to our area.

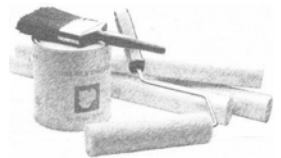

Local Government News.

Dear Reader

So, the wonderful sunny summer weather, the drought and heat goes on, but thankfully South West Water have not put any restrictions on limiting water for the time being for our use. But they do ask us all to be careful and not to waste it. What a glorious time for the tourist season and all those involved with tourism, especially the ice cream makers! However, I do ask a care for the farming world with grass growth for the animals being literally at a standstill, straw prices for cattle bedding soaring in cost because of the shortage of rain. I only hope, because there is bound to be less straw available that farmers will not keep their animals short of bedding and the consequences that would involve.

I must report to all who knew him, the passing aged 95 years of Mr Courtney Johns who was for many years was a member of Kenwyn Parish Council and a business man in Threemilestone. We cannot, at the age of 95 be unduly sad by Courtney's death but pay tribute to a man who was a dedicated Chairman and member of the Parish Council, a position he held with enthusiasm, care and dedication, for which we say a sincere thank you. To his family, children and grandchildren, we send our condolences and they deserve to be proud for all that Courtney did for our community - his loss will be felt by many.

Other issues that crop up from time to time involve, and this happened again recently, are bins – or black plastic bags being put out too early. Sometimes days early from self-catering accommodations and principally seagulls ripping the bags open and the contents, often being helped by the wind, being spread along the road. This can and often does make the whole place very untidy as well as attracting rats. So, I ask you please, if you can, help by putting your waste out, cover it with an old rug/cloth to stop seagulls ripping the bags open trying to obtain food. – Many thanks.

At Cornwall Council's full meeting this week (10th July) as I write, voted with a majority of three votes to buy part of Langarth

Farm to build 154 houses with Sanctuary House builders. I voted against this proposal because the Council is supposed to listen to “localism”. Many of the people in my area or division are telling me that they think the whole scheme i.e. joining Tresillian with Chiverton roundabout, is not a good plan. Also, in the eyes of many, without the provision for essential services, i.e. drainage/sewage systems, in place in place at this time it should not be considered. There will also be a requirement for an electrical sub-station costing millions. These services as well as a road infrastructure for Truro must be in place before the Council or anyone else starts to consider building anything in this area – that is a Stadium or houses. Sorry to end this article on such a negative note but this whole issue has been hanging around my neck for too many years like a huge millstone.

May most of you be able to go and continue to enjoy this glorious summer and I hope that it is a happy one for you all. If there are any issues in your area that fall under the control of Cornwall Council and needs attention, please do not hesitate to contact me by any of the following ways.

From Judith Williams [a lay reader] 8 Saints Cluster

We are now well into the season of Trinity, or, as it used to be known, Pentecost; what John Betjeman, in one of his poems, referred to as, *'The long green Sundays of Pentecost'*. As usual with his poetry, he manages in just a few words to include many images; the greenness which is all around us at this time of the year and which is reflected in the green of vestments and altar frontals in church, and the length, not only of the season but of the long summer days.

We've celebrated a series of incredible events in the Christian calendar, moving from the sombreness of Lent through the glories of Easter Day, through the Ascension, Pentecost and finally Trinity Sunday. It was a time when there was always something new on the horizon.

But now we have come to what the lectionary calls, 'Ordinary

Time', and in many ways that would seem to be very appropriate, for it is the season, not of feasts and festivals, but a time when we hope to enjoy what the old song calls the, 'Lazy, hazy days of summer' .And without the stimulus of feasts in the church's calendar it might be a time when we could easily feel we were entitled to have a holiday from our faith, and let things slide for a bit.

But this 'ordinary time', and the colour green signifying growth, isn't given so we can drift along, but rather calls us to get on with the business of growing in our faith, even though it often doesn't feel like a time of growth. For, deprived of 'high days' and occasions of celebration, it can be hard to feel that there is anything in us to grow. Just as we need physical food to sustain our bodies, we often feel that it is only with continual spiritual 'highs' that our faith is fed.

But this is in fact very far from being the case. What we enjoy at the highpoints of the Christian year needs transforming into the solid ground of our everyday faith in order to sustain us. To use a very mundane analogy, food is necessary for life, but if we overeat and gorge ourselves it does not serve the needs of our bodies, we either get fat or we end up being ill. In neither case are we properly fed. And so, it would be with faith, if all the year were festivals.

But God knows what we need, and now, in these next many weeks of Trinity, we are given space and time to carry out in all the ordinariness of our everyday, unspectacular lives. The things which are of the essence of our faith, all the things which may seem of no account, all the things which are the basics, the solid bed-rock of Christianity, - loving and serving one another in simple, everyday ways; learning to suspend our judgement and hold our tongues; returning good for evil, a kind word for anger, generosity of spirit for meanness of thought; all the, 'Nameless, unremembered acts of kindness and of love', which are indeed Christianity in action, and underpinned always by regular and faithful worship together.

This may not seem of great merit, not deserving of flags or fanfare, but that is what we are called to in this season of Trinity. No wonder we are given so many weeks to practice it!

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

AUGUST UPDATE

Just 14 days later than originally planned some 15 months ago, at 9.00am on Friday 13th July the **First Cut Draft of YOUR Chacewater Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)** was **delivered** (by USB stick) to **Pydar House** in Truro for scrutiny by **Cornwall Council's** own NDP Team. A terrific **TEAM** effort by everyone involved, the aims of this significant milestone are:



- Firstly, to **determine whether we need a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA)** in relation to any planned future development sites – we hope not!
- Secondly, to receive **confirmation that we are on the right track** for the follow-up deliverables that we know *will* be required.

The following **statistical snippets** are aimed at giving you a feel for just how much work has gone into the NDP thus far:

- Production of a **98-page Local Landscape Character Assessment (LLCA)** document detailing key aspects of our surrounding landscape, e.g. Topography, Buildings, Habitat, Transport, Environment, etc. conducted between October 2017 and April 2018.
- Production of a **134 page** in depth **PowerPoint Analysis** briefing document from the **responses to the Autumn 2017 NDP Survey Questionnaire**.
- A 10-page **Business Questionnaire report** from over 50 face to face or phoned interviews conducted with businesses across the Parish in May/June 2018.
- A 9-page **Youth Engagement appraisal** report covering the findings from the event on 22nd May 2018, which has provided us with some really useful detail on what we should be

targeting to improve for our teen aged community over the coming years.

- A 4-page **Draft Chacewater Parish Local List** detailing important, but ungraded, Buildings, Structures and Features that we felt were worthy of documenting, both old and new.
- Finally, the **First Cut Draft NDP itself**, which is currently 80 pages in length, contains details of the Background and History of **OUR** Parish, its Population and Demographics, what we are about Commercial, what the Employment status is, the sort of Infrastructure Amenities and facilities we offer, etc.

To achieve just part of the above, the NDP Team has spent upwards of **40 x 3-hourly group sessions** – mostly in the Wheal Jane Room of the Village Hall – researching and analysing quite literally tons of references, books, maps and other documents before putting themes on paper for interrogation by those who were able and informed. We then set about **developing an extensive set of Policies** aimed at providing a **balanced argument** for the right sort(s) and scale of development we would hope to see **across our Parish** from **now to August 2030 and beyond**.

Key Dates. By the time you read this article, several members of the NDP Team will have met with Cornwall Council's LNDP Team and so will be keen to share their thoughts at our next Monthly NDP meeting at 6.30pm on Monday 6th August in the Wheal Jane Room of the Village Hall. These meetings are **always open to the public, please feel free to pop in and find out more** – your thoughts are always welcome and after all this is your document!

Next Steps. Over the next 2 months, we will need to work up:

VILLAGE PONDWATCH JULY 2018



During a month of hot sunshine the pond water level has dropped by 20cm. More than a hundred yellow/green buds of fringed water lily pepper the surface, like acorns. In sunlight, they open up to bright yellow flowers that stand on short stems above their floating leaves.



All movement seems to be slow in the heat. Newts are rarely seen. In deep shade, a pair of mallard ducks seeks shelter and forages under large lily pads. Once, a gently drifting “lily bud” emerged as the head and yellow neckband of an adult grass snake that slid silently out of the water before disappearing into the reeds. A swallow passes softly over the bramble thicket, skims the water with beak agape and red throat glowing, then banks smoothly and swoops to repeat the manoeuvre.

Bulrush seed heads look like well-rolled Havana cigars. Blackberries have set plenty of hard green fruits, but patches of blossom remain where buff-tailed bees linger. Brown and white butterflies ceaselessly flutter across the pond and through the brambles. In mid-July, tall spires of purple loosestrife flowers begin to open above green leaves. Common carder bumblebees browse on newly-opened knapweed blooms.

Scores of blue and azure damselflies drift continually around the vegetation and briefly sally out across the pond. Pairs fly in tandem and deposit eggs among the floating plants. Some red damselflies also appear, but infrequently. Two red darter dragonflies make forays and hover over the water. Several other dragonflies occasionally visit. A female Southern Hawker arrives like a small bird with a bright green and black ringed body. She hunts around and stops to lay eggs then flies away into the tree tops.

Even when the water surface seems almost to be simmering, still lines of water boatmen lurk just below. Slowly they row and suddenly lunge at other insects. Whirligig beetles circle tirelessly as ever, while their shiny backs reflect the sun like sequins.

JENNY'S GARDEN PATCH ~ AUGUST

August is usually quite a good month weather wise but come nearer the end the days get noticeably shorter and there is a nip in the air, just to remind us that autumn is not that far away.



PLANT OF THE MONTH JAPANESE ANEMONES

Japanese Anemone is a beautiful robust, spreading, perennial, growing up to 1.5m.



Flowers are up to 5cm across and vary from white to various shades of pink. The 5 petals are slightly notched and there is a prominent ring of yellow stamens.

Leaves are large (up to 15cm), palmate, crinkly and slightly sticky.

They are very easy to grow and flower from August right through to the first frosts, are happy in full sun or partial shade and prefer moist, fertile soil and are fully hardy.

To care for your Japanese Anemones:

- Cut back the stalks after the flowers have faded
- Tidy up old dead leaves in March
- Apply a generous 5-7cm (2-3in) mulch of well-rotted garden compost or manure around the base of the plant in spring
- Where necessary lift and divide congested clumps in early spring

AUGUST IN THE GARDEN

Hanging Baskets & Tubs

Ensure tubs and hanging baskets are watered every day and fed with a liquid feed once a week.

Vegetables & Fruit

Feed tomato plants weekly with a liquid tomato feed. Regularly harvest vegetables. Pot up strawberry runners and shear off the foliage just above the crown of the plant. Prune out the old canes of raspberries after they have finished fruiting. Lift and dry onions for storage through the winter.

Perennials

Dead head perennial plants as the flowers fade to keep the border tidy. Support stems of tall perennials.

Lawns

Continue mowing the lawn but in hot, dry weather raise the height of the cut.

Greenhouse

Make sure your plants are well shaded on hot days to prevent scorch. Damp down the greenhouse every morning on hot days to increase humidity.

Cuttings

Take cuttings of fuchsias, pelargoniums and tender perennials.

General

Sow biennials such as wallflowers, Sweet Williams and Canterbury Bells for colour next spring. Buy spring flowering bulbs

That's all for this month apart to remind you that it is important to keep feeding the birds as the youngsters need all the help they can get now that they are finally independent, and the adults need to recover their energies after the tiring breeding season.

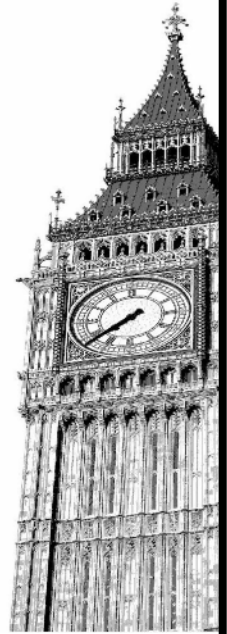

Current Affairs: Chacewater Leads The Charge Towards Electric Vehicles

In gorgeous July sunshine the Chacewater Energy Group team were delighted at the response to their first Electric Vehicle Day on Saturday 14th July, with close to 200 visitors during the afternoon.



Six local car dealerships and two electric bike retailers came to the day to show a range of battery powered vehicles, and many local owner drivers offered free passenger drives around the village. Plus free teas and coffees in the much needed shade of the village hall.

The drop-in event in the Chacewater Village Hall and on the Millennium Green included two very well attended presentations by

Matthew Trevaskis, Head of Electric Vehicles at the Renewable Energy Association and director of Ecodrive Ltd. Lots of highly probing questions from an interested audience.



Formed in spring 2017, Chacewater Energy Group is a community mutual advice service to help Chacewater become more energy self-reliant, fight climate change and share good ideas for free.

Group spokesperson, John Carley, explained why they held the event: “Electric cars have a valuable role to play in our move towards a more sustainable future but many people are still sceptical about whether they can currently offer a viable alternative to fossil fuelled cars. We hope that by bringing together a number of

local experts and electric and hybrid vehicles, they can get answers to questions about range, charge times and costs, and other queries, which may help to fuel their interest in switching to green motoring in the future.”

Exhibitors included Dales of Cornwall with the Renault Zoe EV, Hawkins Motors with the KIA Soul and Niro EVs, and the Peugeot Partner van, Ocean BMW Falmouth with the BMWi8, West End Motors with the Nissan E NV200 van, and Town & Country Motors with their Nissan Leaf. Local bike shops Clive Mitchell Cycles and Top Gear Electric Bikes also had lots of e-bikes on show, offering the chance for people to have test rides and feel the power!

Cormac brought along one of their fully electric vans, equipped with a range of battery powered landscape maintenance machinery, and local firm Truro Tractors also displayed a range of fully electric battery powered garden tools. Local firm TEE were there to explain how simple it is to fit a home charge point, and exploring where the first public charger could go in Chacewater.



Plans are now afoot to stage the second Chacewater EV day sometime in July 2019.

The group is going to hold a Renewable Energy Fair on 15th September, again in the Chacewater Village Hall and (if the weather permits) on the Millennium Green. Check What's On for details, and look out for the reminder banners.
