# CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY WALKING (CROW) GROUP

## SUNDAY 4<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2022

A tad cold on arrival in the Square Car Park for our early December walk, everyone was dressed accordingly with some of our younger trekkers brightening things up with red boots and other Christmas attire. A total of 24 two footers and 3 of our 4-leggers made this particular walk which took us on a lengthy route north, west and back southeast.

On this occasion **the route** took us carefully across Fore Street at the pelican crossing, a short stretch along Station Road before turning left up onto The Terrace to meet with North Hill Byway 25/1. This Byway took us up on around the Wheal Daniel area – where there are some truly terrific views back across the valley towards Anzac Cottage - and ultimately back down to the rear of Carley's and out onto Station Road.

We then headed north, initially taking the path right down towards Jolly's Bottom for about 50 metres before we connected with the short Footpath 20/3 (which we are going to work on in the new year), which took us back up and across Station Road onto Bridleway 20/5. A pretty steep climb then ensued as we headed up to glorious Wheal Busy, where we took a slight pause for breath before turning right along Bridleway 6/4 and on down 6/1, which eventually leads the walker to the foot of our magnificent 7-arched railway viaduct.

We just had to pause again here as we heard the Paddington to Penzance train in the distance and so thought it clever to use for this month's CROW Team photo, as shown.



Well timed, we were soon back on track and heading up the small incline to the left, keeping the old Chacewater Railway Station to our right before eventually crossing the road over to Wheal Busy Chapel and old School House along Byway 39/1. We paused again to take a look in and around the old School House. A few well-appointed boulders identify the transition point onto Bridleway 39/2 which then swept us round towards Boscawen Farm.

Pausing for breath (because this was a long walk and taken at a goodly pace), we started our return to the village along the old miners' route on Byway 2/4 which picks up Bridleways 60/2 and 1 and brings you out at the back of Duckworths. We then turned right

## VINTAGE TRACTOR RALLY

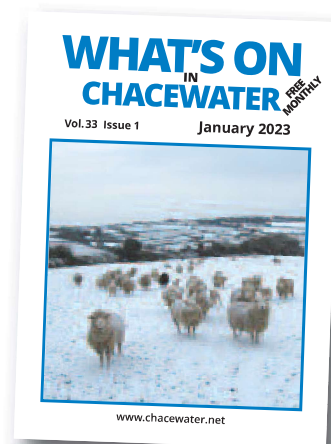

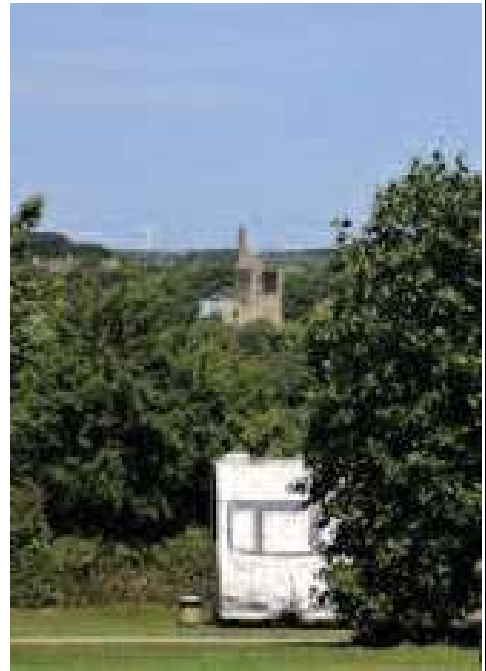

# CONVERSATIONS FROM THE SHED

We've all been eyeing up our rather pleasing leek crop over the last couple of months and hope to be harvesting soon.

Leeks are a cultivar of the wild leek *Allium ampeloprasum*, which can be found growing on rocky coastlines in Cornwall, the Scillies and South Wales. But the leek we all know and love is *Allium Porrum*. Plants of the allium family (which includes leeks, onion, garlic and chives) all contain sulphur compounds which are beneficial to circulatory, digestive and respiratory systems.

So, what better way to celebrate the allium than make a hearty, low cost warming winter soup! Here's our classic allium loaded **Leek and Potato** Soup recipe for you to try:

You will need:

- 30g butter or margarine
- 1 onion, peeled and sliced
- 2 cloves of garlic, peeled and sliced (optional)
- 400g (about 2) leeks, washed and sliced
- 3 medium size potatoes, washed and cubed
- 1L of vegetable stock
- 140ml of milk or single cream
- 3 rashers smoked streaky bacon, chopped (optional)
- Small bunch of parsley (optional)

Melt the butter in a large pan and then fry your onion, garlic and bacon (if using) until they start to develop a golden colour. Garlic (*Allium sativum* - meaning "cultivated" in Latin) isn't essential for this recipe, but why not include this delicious ancient immune boosting herb. Did you know culinary use of garlic was recorded in Babylonian times (c.3000BC) and was

even found in Tutankhamen's tomb!

Then add your leeks and potatoes, give it a good stir and pop the lid on while it cooks gently for about 5 minutes.

Next add hot stock and season with salt and pepper. Put the lid on and let it simmer for 20 minutes until the vegetables are soft. Then blend your soup and add the cream or milk for extra richness.

As a finishing touch you can add a sprinkle of chopped parsley (*Petroselinum crispum*). Ancient Greek



legends tell us that parsley sprang from the blood of Archemorus or Opheltes (the forerunner of Death). It's thought that for this reason warriors used to feed chariot horses with parsley so they could outrun death! Perhaps the perfect finishing touch for a healthy soup!

Keep an eye on our Facebook page (Chacewater Community Garden) to see when leeks, parsley, garlic and onions are available on our produce stand. Alternatively, you could grow your own Alliums at home. February is the perfect time to sow leek seeds indoors, or plant garlic cloves outside. They are considered to be great companion plants for deterring pests, particularly on roses.

# WINTER COMMUNITY LITTER PICKS OFF TO A GOOD START!



A couple of really effective Community Litter Picking sessions took place last month and more are being planned throughout the Winter period, when we can see what is revealed after most of the leaves have fallen from our trees and hedgerows. Our first 'Team' pick started from Wheal Busy early on the 30<sup>th</sup> November and covered a route that took us up past Duckworths, along to Station Road via the wooden railway bridge, from where we went along to the viaduct before heading back up to Wheal Busy once more, via the old Railway Station. We collected 4 good black bag loads, which conveniently coincided with waste collection day.

A second pick early on Sunday the 4<sup>th</sup> December covered the foot of Cox Hill (High Street) up to Truro Tractors, whilst the traffic was a wee bit quieter.

Fortunately, some very kind individuals augment such work by covering the loop from Todpool, to Creegbrowse Crossing, across to Truro Tractors and down back into Todpool once more as well as the route up Church Hill, along the Creegbrowse Ridge Road and back up to the village via the Twelveheads Road. Often unseen, these good folk do a real service for us as a Parish Community and we thank them dearly.

The next hour-long Group pick is provisionally booked the first New Year Litter Pick for **0900 to 1000 on Thursday the 5<sup>th</sup> January** and we will be meeting at the main Car Park on this occasion, so we can cover Station Road as far as the viaduct. If anyone feels like joining in then just turn up – complete with gloves - on the 20<sup>th</sup> and you will be provided with the necessary tools and bags!

We also find litter discarded at both the Recreation Ground and Millennium Green, which trashes the amenity as illustrated by these photos:

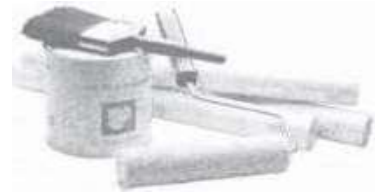

# A REVIEW OF 2022

During the past year we saw the successful return of large social gatherings and the completion of major public works projects.

It was good to welcome new residents and visitors to the parish. Many residents also were able to get away for holiday breaks elsewhere – especially as Chacewater simmered and shrivelled in prolonged summer heat.

Despite some turmoil all around us (*three Prime Ministers, two Heads of State, inflation and shortages, war, famine and disease...*) as the year progressed, the regular rhythms of life returned to our rural community. With the vital help of many reporters who send in notices and news of events, **“What’s On”** aims to keep readers up to date with local happenings.

Every month (except August) Chacewater Rights of Way (CRoW) walkers have explored the public paths and byways throughout the area, charting routes that others may tramp on daily. The Tuesday Pop In provides another chance to meet-up – sitting down with a cuppa!

Every week, gardeners meet to further develop our growing Community Garden and work to plant and maintain floral displays around the village. Chacewater Methodists and St Paul’s Church hold regular services and special events. Chacewater Bowling Club also returned to action, on the green and with activities in the clubhouse.

Every weekday morning, busloads of secondary school students leave the village and return at tea-time. Chacewater School’s PTA is very active finding ways to support the school. Their Easter Egg Hunt was very popular and raised £350.

Regular Bingo, Dancing and Zumba sessions resumed at Chacewater Village Hall, which re-opened to host weddings, parties, performing arts, conferences and classes. Chacewater Players sold-out six shows of their panto *“Aladdin”* in January and followed in May with two nights of *“Charlie and the Chocolate Factory”* and a new play *“Scandal with Scones”*.

The year 2022 began with more public consultation on Cornwall Council’s plan for Chacewater’s main street (the Streetscape) and Chacewater Parish Council launched plans to celebrate the Queen’s 70<sup>th</sup> Jubilee on 3<sup>rd</sup> June. Donations from St Paul’s Church and Cllr Dulcie Tudor’s Community Chest boosted Grant funding from the Arts Council and Cornwall Community Foundation to support family picnics on the Millennium Green with magic and singing in the sunshine. Permanent art-works were created also by street artist Krishna Malla (*“Tech Moon”*) and local school children.

In August, major roadworks were completed as the road from Chacewater Hill to Cox Hill was fully re-surfaced, including new kerbs and ironworks. A 20mph speed limit came

into force throughout the village and the streetscape finished with defined roadside parking bays defended by cast iron planters.

The year ended with a brilliant fireworks display in November enjoyed by hundreds of happy revellers. For the festive season we

invested in bright new lights to decorate the village. The children's Christmas Party made a welcome return and everyone looks forward to gathering round the big tree by the Kings Head to sing carols on Christmas Eve.

# CHACEWATER DOES CHRISTMAS

On the first weekend in December an army of volunteers met up at the King's Head carpark to set about making our village ready for Christmas. Friday saw the preparation of the trees which included whittling down the main trunks to fit in the variously sized holders, then wrapping the trees in lights.

This year the projects group decided that it was time to make a much-needed investment in new lighting sets. Repairs and half dead bulbs have been a problem for a few years and, with the recent increases in running costs, a team was tasked with finding suitable replacements. Better technology and good research resulted in some copper wire battery sets and those lovely LED 'snowballs' that light up to rainbow colours at night – the fixings are easier and more wind resistant and the running costs have been slashed. They have also got built in timers that save another layer of installation.

The BIG tree was hoisted into place by a great bit of teamwork (there is always much debate about the best way to do this and the solution is always forgotten by the following year!) Having so many strong and willing people really helped at this stage – thank you one and all.

Saturday morning involved the ladder work and another worthy team skipped up and down the street ensuring the correct tree was set in each holder. We also dressed the little trees in the new planters.



By Saturday evening the village had been transformed into a Christmas wonderland. The children's party took place in the afternoon after a break of two years with a visit from 'you know who'. The bank above the carpark was filled with shepherds watching a flock of very cute sheep, reminding us of the Christmas Story, and many residents added festive flair to their own homes with lights and decorations bringing a warm, twinkling glow to this dark time of year.

Many hands really did make 'light' work and we are lucky to share this community together.

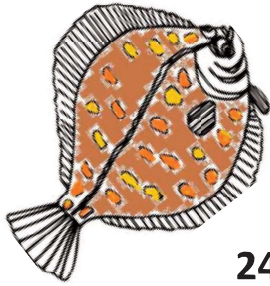


## THANK YOU

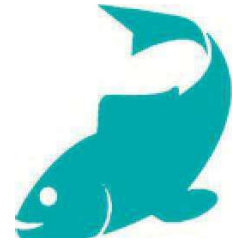

# MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS IN CHACEWATER

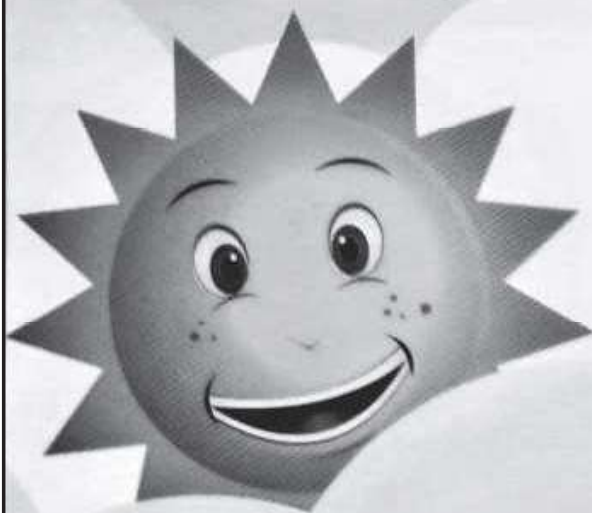

## WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH YOUR REAL CHRISTMAS TREES THIS YEAR?



Cornwall Council (CC) has asked residents to think about how they dispose of real Christmas trees before they buy one this year because, in line with most other local authorities, **CC will only collect trees from households that have subscribed to the garden waste collection service.**

Residents who do not have a garden waste subscription can chip and compost their tree at home or take it to their local **Household Waste and Recycling Centre (HWRC)** for composting. CC also advises residents visiting the HWRC's to use the opportunity to take other items to avoid multiple trips. HWRC's will be open 9am to 4pm throughout the festive period, except for Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

Residents who subscribe to Cornwall Council's garden waste collection service, can put their tree out next to their bin or bag on their usual garden waste collection day in the New Year.

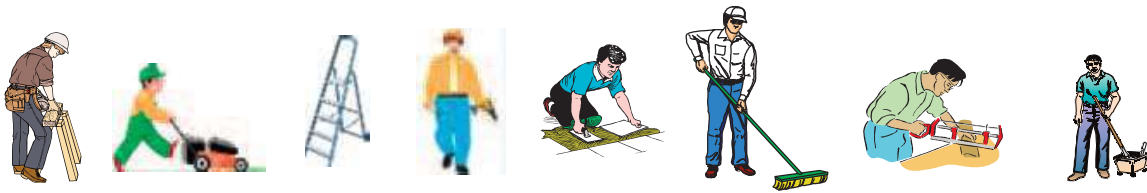

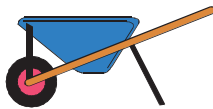
