Chacewater Rights of Way (CRoW) Walk

Sunday 2nd June 2019

Every one of the 16 trekkers (and two of our 4-legged friends) who met at the car park on Sunday the 2nd June said they were up for a slightly more adventurous walk than normal. So, it transpired and hopefully no one was disappointed by the experience or put off from coming along again? You see, a plan had been hatched the previous evening to explore the far reaches of the north east sector of the Parish, in pursuit of a Site of Special Scientific Interest, or SSSI to which it is usually referred, which we eventually found near Pentess Farm.

To get there, we initially crossed Fore Street and headed off towards the Riverside Footpath (301/65/1) as far as the little wooden bridge. We turned right onto footpath 301/66/1 at this point, forked left through a “kissing gate” diagonally across and up the field – *now full of barley* - along footpaths 301/17/1 and 17/2. Eventually arriving up at Tamblын’s Barn, where we noted the ongoing conversion works for what looks to be a nice sized future dwelling.

Having admired the lovely new Cornish wall/hedge that will offer this dwelling protection from the Kea Downs Road, we turned left over the metal style and crossed the Weak Bridge over the main railway line, keeping our eyes peeled for traffic as we went. Once over the bridge, we turned immediately right along (a partly unmarked) Byway 301/30/2 at Stones and headed off down, what appears someone's gravel driveway. This was where the adventurous part of the walk really began, because we soon found a largely unkept footpath (301/21/3) that initially runs straight ahead but soon turns right down towards the Penstraze Road at the rear of what we know to be The Elms. With Cornish hedges either side and a lovely tree lined canopy above, this part of the walk offers a potentially beautiful aspect and so needs to be maintained, which will hopefully be done throughout the summer months.

We actually joined the Penstraze Road about 75 metres south of the entrance to the highly recommended Elm Tree Tea Rooms, which we headed for because it offers the safest point at which to cross the road and dive into the - initially at least - densely overgrown Byway 301/32/1. After about 75 metres we came across the SSSI, which is primarily a wetland area – more research required through the Cornwall Wildlife Trust (CWT) to come me thinks!


At this point three of our party headed off towards the stream that marks the edge of the Parish boundary, to see if we could use it as an alternative return route. Something akin to searching for the Rubicon, our intrepid trio returned advising us that it was probably not really navigable and so we crossed the SSSI instead. The recent dry weather allowed us to do this with relative ease, however, we did need to negotiate an increasingly interested field of cattle before connecting with Bridleway 301/31/1 at a metalled gate near Little Penstraze. Another unkept pathway, the growth here was really like a jungle and so a couple of brave souls risked life and limb (sort of!) hacking away at unwanted stinging nettles – and boy did they sting! Stirring thoughts of how Stanley met Livingstone in the wilds of Africa (1871), we eventually emerged out onto the Penstraze Road again, just opposite the Telephone Exchange. Eyes keenly peeled once more, the sight of 16 bedraggled walkers coming out onto the road at this point definitely amused one driver in particular!

The route back down to the village took us behind the Telephone Exchange where we picked up Byway 301/30/1 and retraced footsteps back towards the Weak Bridge, Tamblyn's Barn and on down towards Chacewater through the aforementioned Barley field along footpath 301/17/1. Saying goodbye to folk

as we passed along The Riverside once again – just as the weather was beginning to take a turn for the worst - this had indeed been an adventure and a half, especially for the younger members of our walking group (and their parents) who had done exceptionally well.

The **next CRoW walk** will leave the Square Car Park at **9.30am on Sunday 7th July 2019**, please do join us if you can – it's fun!

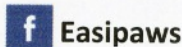

Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

Monthly Update



There are two quite important updates from the NDP Strategy Team this month.

The first is that there will now be a 2-month delay to our planned Referendum because the NDP Steering Gp successfully challenged four *recommended* Policy deletions from the Examiner's Report on the Final Draft of the Chacewater Parish NDP submitted last November. Not wishing to go into too much detail unless it were absolutely necessary, in broad order these issues (and the solutions to each) related to:

- A key **Historic Environment (HE)** policy recommending removal of words stating that we would not wish any heritage building/structure to be demolished for development. **Solution.** As this was not compliant with the Basic Conditions, we eventually agreed with the Local Planning Authority (LPA) to amend our wording in the Introduction section of this policy area.
- Two policies in the **Renewable Energy (RE)** section of the NDP had also identified for removal. These were specifically to do with Community Led Renewable Energy Development and Wind Turbine Development. **Solutions.** With the help of a few experts in the field, we managed to work both policies back into the NDP and in fact the wording now looks much stronger in terms of explanation.
- **The last policy**, for suggested removal, linked directly with our wish - in terms of **Size and Scale** of any single development - not to exceed 10 dwellings. This, according to the Examiner, failed to comply with the Basic Conditions or National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). **Solution.** However, we worked up some subtle yet important word amends, as follows:
 - **Original.** Size and Scale. Future developments should be small scale and any single development *limited to a maximum of 10 dwellings.*

- **Revised.** Size and Scale. Future development should be small scale and any single development ***should be no larger than up to and around 10 dwellings.***

As stated, the unfortunate upshot of making these **changes to Policy wording** is that Cornwall Council now has to put our Final Draft out on another round of Public Consultation, which effectively means that we delay going to Referendum by 2-months. Ultimately, however, this is the right decision for the longer term and makes our Neighbourhood Development Plan a stronger document and one that will strengthen our case against over development.

The Second important point is that, whilst the various stages of NDP development were going through, the Strategy Team had decided to work up a **Parish Design Statement (PDS)**. Another means through which to strengthen our case against over development, this document has now been completed in Draft form and will be presented to the Parish Council for review at the next monthly meeting. Once endorsed, it will then be sent to Cornwall Council for comment/approval as required.

Many residents will recognise the pictures above and below which are *AGAIN* becoming an increasingly familiar sight in and around the Parish. The Seagull and the Crow population are pretty dynamic when it comes to penetrating our bin bags, the result being that rubbish and food waste can be left strewn all over then place in a very short space of time. It is affecting our reputation as a thinking/caring neighbourhood in a very negative way and the poor bin men have an awful task cleaning up this mess. We can all do something to alleviate this problem though, so residents are requested to consider the following actions:

- Use traditional black bin bags, the stronger the better clearly!
- Double Bag up anything that might - *by scent or smell* – be attractive to these predatory creatures.
- Do not leave your waste out overnight – put it out on the morning of collection!
- Approach the Parish Clerk (*see back of What's On for details*) to collect your **reusable** “Seagull-proof” bin bags.



This situation is getting worse and it's all down to a distinct lack of thought. So, let's resolve this ongoing/increasing problem together and not just sit back and expect others to clean up the mess – they don't deserve that!

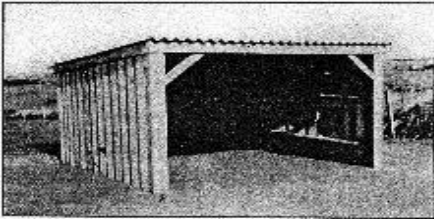
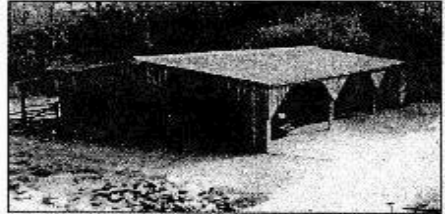

Dear Reader

I recently had a request from a senior citizen to try and get the Disabled Parking space that helps residents of Riverside re-painted. The lines have become quite worn and indistinct and this space was being used by all. I am pleased that the Council has agreed to do it and I hope that it will soon be done. The main point one is trying to make is to ask all other motorists to respect the space as residents with mobility issues are not be able to walk too far.

We have recently had some motor cyclists “dirt tracking” in the Wheal Busy area to the worry and annoyance of local residents, walkers and pony riders. I have asked the Police and Cornwall Council’s enforcement department to try and train these people to behave more responsibly and respect residents and other users.

If any of you are keen on walking, try going down to Twelveheads and when there look at the Playing Field beside the Chapel, it is having a great “makeover” with new picnic tables, paving in some areas and fencing erected. If it is a nice weather, it has become a very enjoyable area to relax in.

At County Hall all Parish Councils have been asked by Cornwall Council and the Boundary Commission to look at their boundaries to see if there are any issues that should be addressed. I know that Chacewater and Kea have some minor amendments to recommend. However, Truro Parish wants to take over a big area of Kenwyn which is worrying because it affects the income of that parish. I am sure that Kenwyn Parish Council will be resisting such a significant land grab from the City Council.

I hope any resident who attended the recent Royal Cornwall Show on the Friday has since dried out!! The Thursday and Saturday brought, on the whole, ideal show weather.

## Can Anyone Identify This Plant?

What IS this plant that suddenly seems to be a so many of our hedgerows this year. With yellow flowers it is widespread. It's quite pretty but I'd hate to see taking over as the dreaded Japanese Knotweed has done. It is SO suddenly widespread that it could well be a cause for concern.

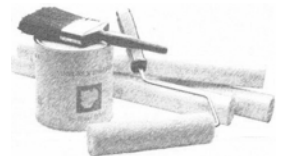

## VILLAGE PONDWATCH JUNE 2019



Small movements continually mark the water where pondlife is teeming as the weather warms. Newts turn lazily in nests among the weeds or slowly drift in the sunshine. One slides up a sunken plant stalk, snaps at some prey and rolls away. Late tadpoles, a handful, graze in the shallows still, while one or two swim in open water. Here, whirligig beetles trail in pairs and gyrate wildly when others join in.

Water boatmen and small beetles cause ripples when they lunge at smaller animals. Submerged water stick insects make no disturbance as they swim and strike at passing prey. However, they may push aside floating leaves as they forage beneath or clamber through the surface film.

A spell of hot, dry, days caused the water level to drop nearly 15cm. A mallard drake sat in the shade all afternoon and a grass snake slid stealthily through floating vegetation. In the first week of June, a few damselflies – azure and red – fluttered at the pond's edge. Brown Speckled Wood and Orange-tipped white butterflies dodge past while Broad-bodied chaser dragonflies also patrolled the area.

Persistent rain re-filled the pond and refreshed plant growth during the second week of June. A gang of sparrows and a pair of nesting blackbirds visit every day. Searching for food, the sparrows skip along bramble branches and cling to stems of bulrushes. One female plucks an emerging damselfly off a spearwort stalk and carries it away. A pair of swallows sweeps low across the Millennium Green grassland and bumble bees plunder bramble flowers.

It is a treat to spot a Great Silver Diving Beetle as it ruffles across the surface of a weed bed. He is shiny black, like a Pontefract cake, and as big as a thumb – at least 4cm long and 2cm wide.

## CORNISH MINING WORLD HERITAGE SITE GETS £1M FOR WHEAL BUSY CONSERVATION

Since 2014 the World Heritage Site has prioritised Wheal Busy Smithy as a conservation project and for many years before this members of the team, the local community and Cornwall Council have searched for a solution to

preserve this fantastic piece of history, which is a noted feature of ‘Outstanding Universal Value’ within the World Heritage Site.

Whilst being a well-known feature in the Chacewater area, the building has unfortunately been underutilised for some time which has led to deterioration of the scantle-slate roofing. The winter storms of 2014 also caused the partial collapse of the building’s south eastern corner, increasing concerns about its continued stability.

In 2018 the World Heritage Office approached Highways England with the aim of getting the Smithy included as one of the projects to be funded by the Highways England A30 Environmental Designated Funds. Since then the World Heritage Team has worked with Highways England, Arup contractors, Members of the Chacewater Parish Council and Tregothnan Estate to get the project approved for funding. We are delighted to announce that this project has now been approved for £1 million in funding. The Smithy is likely to be developed for community usage.

The Smithy workshop at Wheal Busy near the former mining village of Chacewater is unique within the Cornwall and West Devon Mining Landscape World Heritage Site and is thought to be the largest historic blacksmiths on a metalliferous mine in Britain.

Wheal Busy is a very important name in the annals of Cornish mining. The production of copper and tin in the area around Chacewater dates from the seventeenth to the early twentieth centuries, with the mine first being mentioned in 1666. Wheal Busy also saw the successive installation of early innovations in steam technology; a Newcomen atmospheric engine was at work dewatering the mine by around 1726, with this role assumed by a Smeaton improved atmospheric engine by 1775-1776. Eventually a Boulton & Watt separate condenser engine was installed, this being the first of its type to operate in Cornwall when it was put to work by its designer James Watt in 1777.

As an acknowledged feature of ‘Outstanding Universal Value’, or international significance, within the World Heritage Site, the preservation of the Smithy is of the highest priority to the World Heritage Site team. Designated a Grade II Listed building, the Smithy has an extensive scantle-slate roof and impressive cast iron lintels over its two main entrances. The building P.T.O.

owes much of its grand form to a major reworking of the mine in the 1870s and the lintels boldly proclaim the title: 'Great Wheal Busy Mines 1872'.

Julian German, Chair of the World Heritage Site Partnership, commented that "the Partnership very much welcome the support that Highways England have pledged through the A30 Environmental Designated Funds scheme. The Wheal Busy Smithy poses a significant conservation challenge but this announcement will enable the emergency stabilisation of the building, which is a well-known and highly regarded feature of international importance within the World Heritage Site."

The World Heritage Site team are delighted that funding has been approved for the Smithy and look forward to working closely with Highways England, the Tregothnan Estate and the community of Chacewater to deliver the much-needed conservation of this unique aspect of Cornwall's mining heritage.

## IN MEMORIAM

**Pte. John Harold SPARGO** - Canadian Infantry, 78<sup>th</sup> Bn.

**Died 28<sup>th</sup> July 1918**

John Harold Spargo was born near Chacewater on 15<sup>th</sup> July 1889. He was the third son of Elizabeth and William Spargo, a tin miner. John was unmarried, 5' 5" tall, with brown eyes and black hair. He worked as a Fireman in the town of Ironwood, Michigan, U.S.A. until he crossed the lake and signed up with the Canadian Overseas Expeditionary Force on 13<sup>th</sup> October 1917.

Declared fit, he was assigned service number 2173577 in the 100<sup>th</sup> Winnipeg Grenadiers Draft. Before leaving Canada, John Harold received extensive dental treatment. One tooth was extracted and bridgework with two molars created for his lower jaw. In his upper jaw, bridgework replaced two front teeth and two molars. A gold filling to another front tooth completed the work. Pte. Spargo was transferred to the Manitoba Regiment and sailed from Halifax, Nova Scotia, aboard *SS. Mergantic* on 26<sup>th</sup> November 1917. The ship arrived in Liverpool, England on 8<sup>th</sup> December 1917.

Just before Christmas, John Spargo was hospitalised for six weeks and treated for psoriasis which afflicted the skin all over his body, arms and legs. Discharged in February, John may have had the chance to visit family in Cornwall before he was shipped across the Channel on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 1918. In France, he joined his unit – the 78<sup>th</sup> Battalion – on 9<sup>th</sup> July, a week before his birthday.

Two weeks after his 29<sup>th</sup> birthday, Pte. John Harold Spargo was killed in action on 28<sup>th</sup> July 1918. He lies buried in the small military cemetery at the village.

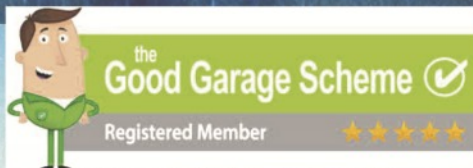
