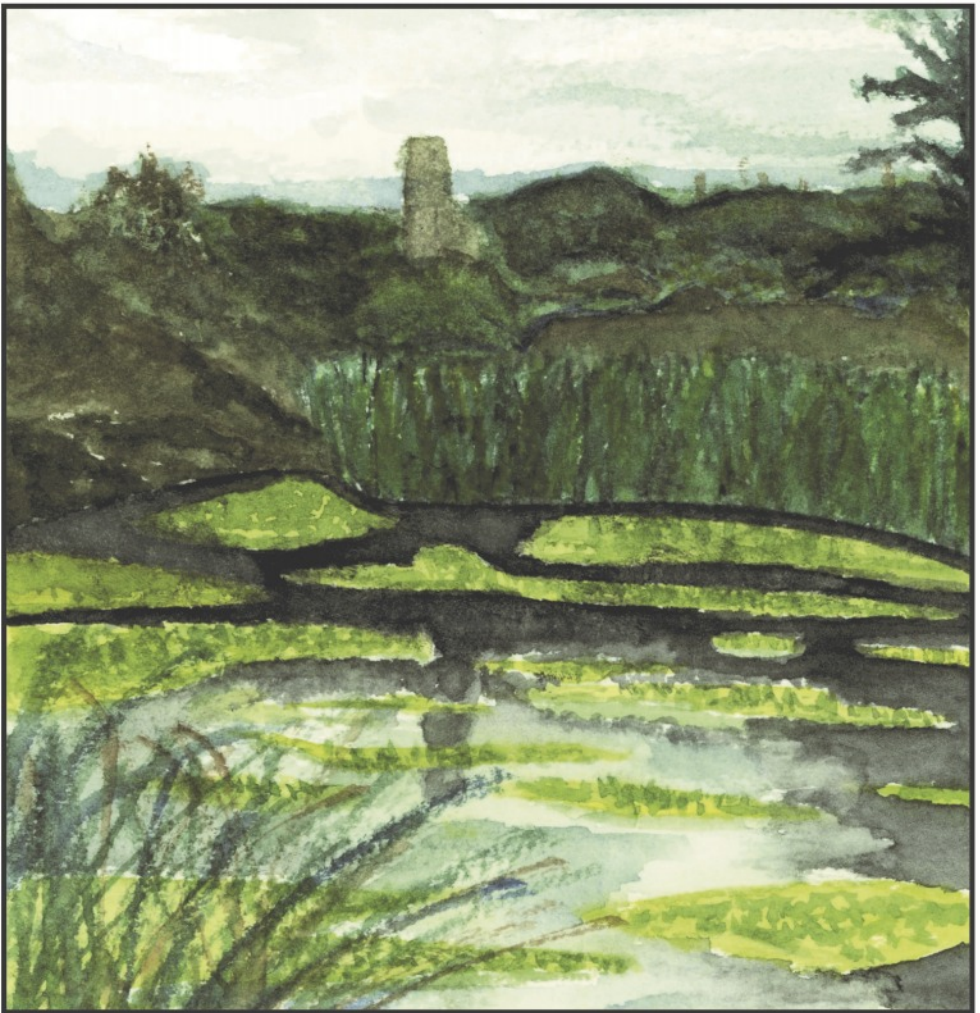

# **CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY (CROW) WALK**

**SUNDAY 5<sup>th</sup> MAY 2019**

In continuance of the theme to spread news on the many changes occurring in and around the Parish - both now and into the future - the idea of this particular CRoW walk was to provide updates and exchange of ideas up at Wheal Busy before trekking off and over towards the Carhot area. The views were stunning and the sun was out all the way, so what was there not to like about walking around this wonderfully interesting place in which we live.

The route itself took us from the main car park and across Fore Street pedestrian crossing to Station Road before entering The Terrace and along 200 metres to the foot of Wheal Busy Lane. At about the 100 metre point up the lane (well before reaching Hillside Farm) we paused for a moment or two at the right side entrance to the Public Right of Way (PRoW) 301/6/3 leading up towards the top end of Wheal Busy, to discuss what has been done (and soon will be) along this particular bridleway in order to maintain its integrity as a walking route. In short, this lane had been subjected to a good deal of off-road abuse in recent times and so the good people of Hillside Farm have installed a couple of gates half way up to ensure a focus on pedestrian access and animal safety is retained. More work will soon be done to ensure the disturbed rubble on this pathway no longer slips down Wheal Busy Lane and out onto The Terrace, as has happened over the past couple of years.

Before long we were walking along the ridge that looks down over Wheal Busy and then turned left along PRoW 301/5/1, passing the Cornwall Observatory site on the right; which we hope (fingers crossed) will be re-energised at some point throughout 2019! We then paused at the right turning at PRoW 301/62/1 to explain more about the planned refurbishment of the Old Smithy building which, thanks to the Highways England (HE) A30 dual-carriageway designated funding and cooperation with Tregothnan Estates, should be completed within 2 years but may be sooner. This project has huge potential for the wider community and looks to be a really exciting opportunity to develop the area in the right way – so watch this space as they say!

Soon we emerged from PRow 301/62/1 out near the crossroads and lane (PRow 301/39/1) leading to the Wheal Busy Chapel, where the recent addition of a park bench can be used by anyone using this part of the Mining Trails loop through Wheal Busy. Almost halfway between Portreath and Devoran, we think it quite apt to name this asset the “Take a Rest and Be Thankful” bench – thanks to the Parish Council for funding it.

After our swift “photoshoot” we headed off down the hill towards the wooden railway bridge where we were met by the most wonderful tree lined/canopied view of the Carnhot area on the other side of the valley across Station Road. This photo barely does it justice, it is a must see area, especially given that there is now a resting place – the aforementioned bench.

On, down the road and across to Carnhot on PRow 301/9/1, but not before discussing a second planned HE A30 designated funded project that should see the Cornwall Wildlife Site (CWS) wetland area just south of the

A30 hopefully transformed into a pooled wildlife, water and walking area by the middle of 2021 at the latest. More terrific news then, we lifted our feet for the last leg of this walk back along public bridleways (301/8/2, 1


and 3) near Carnhot and Little Jollys Bottom Farms before emerging out along a beautifully blossomed lane near Station Road, which took us back into the heart of Chacewater village – again, the photo barely does the scene justice.

1 hour and 30 mins “door to door” as they say, the **next CRow walk** will leave the Square Car Park at **9.30am on Sunday 2nd June 2019**, so keep the diary free and feel free to join us if you wish!

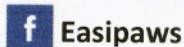

**Chacewater Parish Council held the Parish Meeting at the end of April.** Reports were given by Parish Chairman, Cllr. Martin Stephens and by Cornwall Council Member, Cllr. John Dyer. These follow here. No Report was received from the Police.



## **CHACEWATER PARISH COUNCIL**

### **CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT**

2018/19 has been an exceptionally busy year for the council and I must pay tribute to the hard work done in various forms by all of our councillors, in addition the exceptional work done by our local neighbourhood development plan team the majority of which are members of our local community, although it is good to see that two of the team have since joined the council. The LNDP is now coming to its final stages, at present it is under examination and that looks good at the moment. Again, well done to all those involved, quite an exceptional effort.

Last Autumn we were able to get rid of the leylandii in the car park because they had become out of control and dangerous. I believe that over the last two years, perhaps a lesson has been learnt and in future we must learn to manage our trees and not let them get out of hand. And whilst talking about trees I must mention that in the storms over the winter we did unfortunately lose our coronation oak at the top of the steps in the car park.

Clean up work was carried out at the far end of the recreation ground by some of our councillors and local volunteers together with some welcome help from the staff at Highways England.

Funding has now been applied for to place two VAS's ( vehicle activation signs ) at either end of the village, and these hopefully will be approved and installed shortly.

The Parish Council have now taken on the lease of the playing fields at Twelveheads and have recently secured a £5,000.00 grant towards tidying it up and fencing it to make it safe. Work there is already well underway.

Unfortunately we have lost Charlotte Bearham as our clerk, and P.T.O.

must thank her for all her hard work whilst she was with us. She has ably been replaced by Christina Shepherdson who is settling in successfully to the job, and thanks to Charlotte for her involvement in contributing to a smooth hand over.

We continue to have issues with Cornwall Council, such as pot holes and fly tipping although to be fair to them their online reporting system has greatly improved and on the maps provided it is easy to identify the offending sites. Hopefully the speeding problems in the village will improve once the installation of the VAS's are approved and completed. Planning is another area we have concerns about and take seriously and would ask Cornwall Council to pay more attention to local views and knowledge when considering local planning applications, something they will be legally obliged to do once our Neighbourhood Development Plan is finally in place.

We will continue to pressure Cornwall Council into doing things for the benefit of our Parishoners.

Looking to the future we have started to put together plans for rebuilding the pavilion and improving the facilities there and making applications for grant funding. I know that car parking is a concern for many in Chacewater, we have set up a working party to look closely at various options, and in particular the misuse of the car park, and any future possibility of expansion.

We continue to talk to Tregothnan about the future of the Wheal Busy area amongst other things, hopefully we will eventually see things improving there in the fullness of time.

I am pleased to report that the Parish very much continues to thrive in many areas and the future looks very exciting.

We have over the year almost achieved our full complement of Councillors, but unfortunately for one reason or another some have decided to move on, and we now have 2 vacant seats which we would love to have filled, and would appeal to anyone who might be interested to come and join us.

Finally I must extend my grateful thanks to all my fellow Councillors who

have supported me over the last twelve months that I have had the honour to be your Chairman.

## **2019 Annual Chacewater Parish Report** **from John Dyer Cornwall Councillor for** **Chacewater, Kenwyn and Baldhu**

The major application in our area is and has been for some time (since 2009 when outline planning permission was granted) is the Langarth application

Cornwall Council have recently (during the parish year) decided sensibly to call the whole development spread over 2,5 miles -the Langarth Development. It has in the past been named after the individual farms or simply the land north of the A390 west of Truro.

Cornwall Council, who are behind this development, are supportive because the total number of houses planned will have a great impact on the national governments requirements of houses needed to be built by 2030 in Cornwall. What the Council have done again very recently is to set up a working party of both Truro and Kenwyn Parish Council due to partly the revision of the Truro and Kenwyn Local Plan with all the Cornwall Councillors elected for this combined area. Cllr Dulcie Tudor has been elected the Chairman and I am the Vice-Chairman, and it seems we shall be meeting every Tuesday afternoon from 4 - 5.30 for the foreseeable future.

The whole development frustrates me as no one will plan or take decisions about ensuring that the infrastructure will cope e.g. drainage, traffic, etc. etc. Only yesterday, as I write, it took our daughter over 40 mins to get out of Thremilestone (where she lives) at 10.30 am and drive to the Treliske Hospital roundabout, a maximum of 2 miles, mid-morning after the commuters have been through. - it just does not get any better.

Two other major issues-

i) *Drainage*. - Although as Cornwall Council Members we have seen sketch plans for the sewage disposal system from South West Water, the detailed plans have yet to be submitted; nor the whereabouts of the 4 proposed pumping stations en-route from Penstraze to Calenick which is a

distance of at least 4.5 miles. There has also been an application submitted for an anaerobic digestion system that has also yet to be considered by the planning system. This will have to be studied in detail because any failure will lead to raw sewage ending up in the River Kenwyn and, via the river course, will quickly end up in the centre of Truro at Victoria Square. Smells, air pollution and wind direction towards the hospital are another significant concern.

ii) *The proposed Northern area access road*, This road will take most of the traffic from the development areas and, even the Planners admit, 2 cars per household per dwelling need to be allocated. Cyclists and pedestrians will find this route difficult because of the hills. To date the plans of the Northern Area access road are to end at the Eastern end (of this so called relief road) into the Royal Cornwall Hospital complex at Treliske. But the question is will the RCHT Board allow this as they own all the land and the road within the hospital from where it goes past the innovation Centre, Gravel Car Park, Mobility Centre and Helicopter landing pad?

It has been a great privilege to represent this area that I have always lived in and one I still enjoy. As part of my role this year I have been able to give several grants from the Community Budget that each Cornwall Council member is allocated. I am delighted that I have been able to help people and organisations from all three parishes that I represent through this diverse large geographical area. In Chacewater I have been able to give financial grants to Wheal Velocity Academy and New Gazebos for their events; the removal and replacement of disabled parking spaces in the High St and Riverside; Chacewater Parish Council (Special Events) to provide a new portable BBQ for community use; the repainting of the lettering on the War Memorial outside St. Paul's Church, Chacewater and also on the War Memorial outside the Passmore Edwards Institute (now the village Hall) in Blackwater because both building and War Memorial are actually in Chacewater Parish.

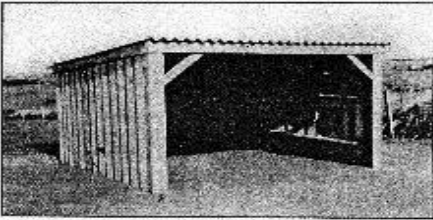

## **PUBLIC SPACES UPDATE**

A great deal of volunteer work has gone into some of our public space of late, so here is a snapshot of change improvements:

- The installation of the new **“Take a Rest and Be Thankful” park bench** on the Mining Trail up at **Wheal Busy**, at the entrance to the lane leading to the Chapel.
- The **newly grassed area, floral garden patch** (once the old sand pit) and **beech tree sapling areas at the western end of the Recreation Ground**, which can now be used as an area for relaxation – we just ask users to respect it and take their rubbish home with them please.
- The **Twelveheads Play Park upgrade**, which now boast **several recycled wooden play equipment stances** for young children to enjoy. By the time you read this article, we hope also to have finished the accessible community resting space behind the bus shelter, painted the football pitch goal posts white and provided an accessible access to the play park itself.

The whole project should conclude in June with the installation of a good quality perimeter chain link fence that will enable all comers to view the wildlife environment that forms such a vital part of where the Poldice Valley stream meets with the Carnon River.

## **From St Paul's Church**

It's summertime and once again Cornwall opens its arms and borders to tens of thousands of visitors.

They come by car – many towing caravans - by train, camper van, coach, ferries and yachts. Thousands take to the beaches, to the cliff paths and crowd into the narrow shopping streets of our towns and resorts.

Camp sites are opened up once again, B&B signs go up on the front of cottages, farms and terraced houses, and restaurants, pubs, cafes and gift shops get ready for the onslaught!

And despite the inevitable tail back at every roundabout, the overflowing car parks and the long queues at the approaches to our most popular towns, visitors are on the whole generally welcomed by us locals, happy to share the beauty of our county with all those who live and work in less beautiful surrounds.

It has saddened me, therefore, that over the last three years, following the vote to leave the EU, many of our friends and neighbours in places like France, Holland and Eastern Europe, suddenly feel unwelcome and unwanted by the people of the British Isles. It has shown a divide between rural populations and urban areas and fears that supplies of fresh food, medicines and even parts for our cars will be held up at our borders.

And it looks like we shall soon have to turn the clock back to the days when Green Cards, visas and travel permits will be required when any of us cross The Channel.

So, a country divided, a country uncertain of its future and of its trading and diplomatic role in the world, and communities and families still bitterly divided on whether we should stay or go.

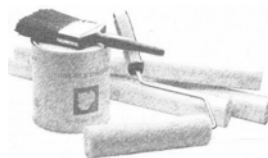

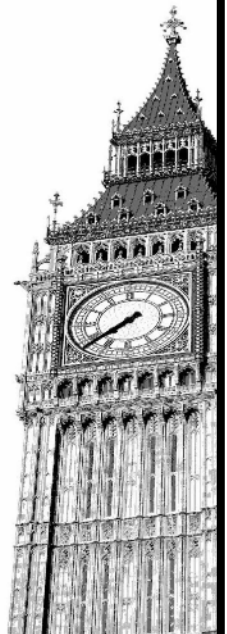

## **NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN (NDP)** **MONTHLY UPDATE**

I think that all those directly involved in the process will have been a tad frustrated at how slowly things seem to have progressed over the past 6 months, since the Final Draft of the Chacewater Parish NDP was submitted to our Local Planning Authority (LPA) in November last year that is. A 2-week delay initially resulted from the Christmas break, because the document itself had to pass across numerous statutory desk areas within Cornwall Council. This saw a further in delay getting the Plan to our nominated Examiner, Deborah McCann. Deborah has since worked promptly and has done a really good job (we believe) in analysing our Final Draft, which has to meet some Basic Conditions set out by National Planning and Policy Framework guidance. We did have some questions in response to her Examiner's Report and these have been answered in pretty quick fashion also. The issues themselves were important and specifically related to:

- The size of any development within our Settlement Boundaries, which we insisted should be Small Scale – we want to put clear figure that a developer could not exceed.
- Not wanting to demolish any of our heritage buildings for the sake of new development.
- Questions over how we shape the various arguments in relation wind power Renewable Energy, where it might be appropriate for this area.

At the time of typing this article, we await a meeting with Cornwall Council to discuss the details regarding the above issues. Further, we have been advised of further delays to our own NDP Referendum because of the EU Elections, which will now take precedence.

**In effect, and provided all goes well, this means we are now looking at the mid to end of July 2019 before we ask you to vote in support of the last 2 years of volunteer work it has taken to put YOUR Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) together for YOU!**



## VILLAGE PONDWATCH MAY 2019

The village pond lies quietly in the Millennium Green beside Chacewater Village Hall. It is a man-made but naturally self-regulating body of water which provides food and living space for lots of wildlife. There is always something to see. Plants and most insects care little about human presence. If one remains quiet and still it is usually possible also to watch birds and amphibian activity. **[Caution: The sides are slippery and the water is deep enough to drown in. Children should be supervised at all times.]**

The ground is carpeted with many flowers and hedgerows beside the pond are splashed with their colours. Yellow dandelions and buttercups stand by red campion plants and mists of blue speedwell. House sparrows and a pair of goldfinches forage among the reeds and brambles while a chaffinch drinks at the water's edge. A blackbird often wades through the weeds and dabbles under the lily leaves.

In the pond, whirligig beetles swirl across the surface. By mid-May some tadpoles remain in small groups grazing in the shallows while a few larger ones navigate the deeper water. Sediment is stirred and clouds the water, limiting visibility to a depth of 15 – 20 cm. One newt snaps at a raft of algae as another displays its orange belly. As the temperature rises, palmate newts drift and cruise slowly just below the surface. Two more swim side by side.

Cruising in open water, a water stick insect lunges repeatedly at passing whirligig beetles. A water boatman tracks a single tadpole and a Great Diving



Beetle surfaces briefly before plunging downwards again. In early evening a water stick insect rears out of the water, stands on a small lily leaf and rocks it. Later, another insect climbs aboard and both stay together for several minutes. After the first slides out and returns to the water, the second remains on the leaf. Was this a dominance display, a contest or a coupling?
