Unity Wood - Presentation

Unity Wood located on the southwest side of our Parish, is currently being subject to coppicing and many walkers / other visitors have been quite alarmed at what appears to be very drastic tree felling and clearing in large areas. This woodland, consisting mainly of oak, is owned and managed by the Tregothnan Estate and the coppicing itself has been brought to the attention of our Parish Council as well as our neighbouring parishes in Gwennap and St. Day.

The woodland routes are enjoyed and appreciated by local walkers, cyclists and other users as well as visitors to the area which is something recognised by Tregothnan as is their awareness for the protection of natural fauna and wildlife. New trees will be planted during the coppicing period.

In response to a number of concerns raised by the public, Mr Andrew Jarvis CEO at Tregothnan in conjunction with Mr Herron their forestry manager, have kindly offered to give a presentation on what and why this extent of coppicing is required.

Parishioners from Chacewater, Gwennap and St. Day are welcome to a brief presentation during the morning only at 10am Tuesday 7th May in the Village Hall in Chacewater.

Chacewater Football Club



Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) – Monthly Update

The Chacewater Parish Neighbourhood Development Plan is **getting ever nearer to Referendum Day**. Our Final version has been scrutinised by an independent Examiner (Mrs Deborah McCann) and we received the first factual “in confidence” copy of the Examination Report at the beginning of April. 37 pages in all, the report largely agreed with our policies but drew our attention to 3 relatively minor issues only. So, we are in compliance which it was good to know and we have been marching along the right pathway throughout the past 24 months which means your NDP Strategy Team has not been wasting their time!!

So, what happens next? Well, we have sent an acknowledgement of the **Examiner’s Report** to Cornwall Council as our Local Planning Authority (LPA) and so expect another copy to be sent back to the Strategy Team in pretty short order so we can to make those final, relatively few, amendments. **With luck, the LPA will then identify a date for our Referendum, which we hope will occur around the end of May.....**almost 2 years on from the day we started this significant community project.

Coincidentally, we are also nearing the delivery stage of the **Parish Design Statement (PDS)**. This aims to compliment the NDP and identify more clearly - to any would be developer - what the area is all about to us as a community and, therefore, what we as a community expect them or their architect to consider as they go through the machinations of submitting any future planning proposal(s). In short, we like what we have, want to improve where we can but must protect our surrounding green and open countryside and recognise our steep heritage.

St Day Self Builds

Public Consultation Event

Have you ever dreamt about building your own home?

We are proposing 25 self build plots on the edge of St Day. They will be fully serviced plots (water, sewerage & electricity connections), with roadways, back up support to guide you through the build including a 16 hours a day, 7 days a week helpline, discounted architectural fees, access to self-build mortgages. We will be suggesting a mix of 3 & 4 bedroom detached houses and bungalows on sizeable plots.

The main reasons people self build: -

- You control the design that you and your family need for the future
- You control the quality of the build
- You can make it environmentally friendly—which reduces your monthly bills
- It is a cheaper way to home ownership
- It will cost you less to build than to buy from a developer
- It is a rewarding experience, to be able to stand back and say—"We built that!"

There are three options for your self-build:

- 1) Full self build—you do everything.
- 2) Shell fit out—you finish the inside of a weatherproof shell
- 3) Custom build—a builder completes your designs

Come along for the public consultation and complete an "Express of Interest" form to sign up to be considered as a new plot owner. These homes will **NOT** be under the affordable housing scheme, as we want to make the plots affordable and under market value, for local people.

This public consultation event is for the village to come along and discuss the design, styles and carbon reducing technologies, as well as for people to register their interest and discuss what it is like to self-build. We can guide you through the process, as we are self-builders and we can tell you how it works.

IN MEMORIAM

Joiner **Ernest HOLLAND**, Royal Navy H.M.S. *Invincible*. Died **31 May 1916**

Ernest HOLLAND [344826] was in his 15th year of Royal Navy service when he was killed in the main action of the Battle of Jutland on 31st May 1916.

Ernest was born on 1st December 1875 and raised in Truro, the 6th son of Sarah and Thomas Holland – a shoemaker. The family lived on Richmond Hill near the railway station. As a 14-year-old Ernest was apprenticed to a Cabinet maker until he was 21. He signed up as a carpenter for a 12 year engagement in the Royal Navy on 18th January 1902. Aged 26 and 5' 2¾" tall, he had brown hair and grey eyes.

After basic seaman training, Ernest went to Portsmouth where he joined the crew of the battleship *H.M.S. Majestic*, flagship of the Channel Squadron. In February 1904 he was posted on to *H.M.S. Caesar* when she replaced her sister ship as flagship. Following a year of shore-based training at Portland he joined the battleship *H.M.S. Goliath*, bound for China, in May 1905.

On 27th May 1905 the Japanese navy destroyed a Russian fleet at Tsushima. Confirmation of the Anglo-Japanese alliance led to recall of RN battleships and when *Goliath* got to Colombo, Ceylon she was sent back to the Mediterranean Fleet. In January 1906 *Goliath* was transferred to the Channel Fleet and returned to Chatham for refit. In October, Ernest Holland became Leading Hand of *Goliath's* carpenter crew and retained that post for another 2½ years. Ernest married Philippa Olive Gay in the summer of 1907. Meanwhile, his ship joined the new Home Fleet and was based in Portsmouth where she had a further refit during the autumn and winter. *Goliath* re-commissioned with the Mediterranean Fleet where she served for 9 months before returning to Portsmouth in April 1909.

Ernest was able to meet his baby son Arthur Ernest James and spent the next year working at naval training establishments around Portsmouth. In August 1910 he sailed to Hong Kong on the cruiser *H.M.S. Royal Arthur*. On arrival, he joined the crew of another cruiser *H.M.S. Alacrity* – just 3 weeks before his second son, Edgar Claude was born on 31 October.

Ernest remained in the Far East with *Alacrity* for the next 2½ years and came back to Portsmouth in April 1913 to complete technical training and pass as a Joiner in August. Another 4 months service aboard the pre-dreadnought battleship *H.M.S. Britannia* brought him to the end of his first 12 years and he signed on for continued engagement on 18th January 1914. After another 2 months course at *H.M.S. Excellent*, Ernest was posted to the new battleship

H.M.S. Iron Duke, flagship of the Home Fleet based at Scapa Flow. On 1st May 1914 he was established as a Joiner and 3 months later transferred to the battlecruiser *H.M.S. Invincible* on 3rd August 1914 – the day Germany declared war on France.

On the same day, *Invincible* was ordered to southern Ireland to guard against a German breakout. Later, she was sent to the Humber and crossed the North Sea to engage in the Battle of Heligoland Bight at the end of August. On 11th November 1914, Ernest Holland and *Invincible* sailed from Devonport for the South Atlantic. They arrived at the Falkland Islands on 7th December and the next day destroyed the German cruisers *Scharnhorst* and *Gneisenau*.

After the battle *Invincible* docked in Gibraltar for refit on 1st January 1915 and returned to Scotland in March - where she was joined by sister ships *H.M.S.*

Indomitable and *H.M.S. Inflexible* to form the 3rd Battle Cruiser Squadron at Rosyth. At some time that year Ernest would have got a train ticket and leave to travel back home to Cornwall to see his wife and young sons living on a farm in Kea.


In May 1916, the 3rd BCS was sent north to join Admiral Jellicoe's Grand Fleet at Scapa Flow. As the battle of Jutland unfolded in early evening of 31st May, *H.M.S. Invincible*, flagship of Admiral Hood, was the lead ship which began to engage the German High Seas Fleet. Exchanging fire with four German ships, *Invincible* was hit by 5 shells from the battlecruiser *Derfflinger* and was blown in half by a massive explosion at 6.34pm. Ernest Holland and 1,029 crewmates were killed. 6 officers and men were blown clear and survived.

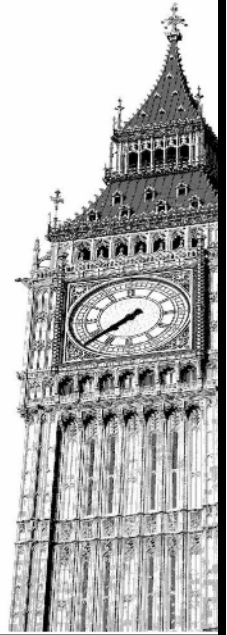

Chacewater Parish Council Annual Parish & General Meetings

On Friday 26th April Chacewater Parish Council will have held its Annual Parish Meeting and on Friday 31st May will have the Annual General Meeting.

What's the difference, you may ask!

At the Annual Parish Meeting we hear reports of the activities over the past year from the Parish Council Chairman (which will be published next month), the Cornwall Councillor for this Parish and a report from the Devon & Cornwall Police.

At the Annual General Meeting Councillors will elect the new Chairman, Vice-Chairman and other positions of responsibility – all of which are voluntary. Councillors also take on the role of representing the Parish Council on other organisations where applicable.

One voluntary position is that of the Tree Officer. This position is not usually a Councillor, rather a person having an interest in trees and a willingness to offer advice to the Parish Council as needed. In an earlier edition of "What's On in Chacewater" an appeal was made for such a volunteer. We are still looking for that person so the original article is duplicated below. If you might be interested please make contact - don't wait to be asked as we may not know about you or your interests.

What is the Parish Tree Warden and What Do They Do?

Along with Councillors this is a voluntary position and is usually filled by someone in the Parish with an interest in the community and the environment.

Unlike Councillors who are usually elected by the residents, the Tree Officer is invited by the Parish Councillors to fulfil a role in order to assist them when making decisions. They may be asked to look at a planning application to see if there are any issues with regards to trees, whether that be to protect them, remove them, or plant them. In this case they may be asked for their expert opinion on what species would be appropriate.

They may be asked to keep an eye on the trees around the area and to inform the Parish Council of any problems. Or, at the request of the Parish Council they may offer advice to residents on trees near dwellings etc.

Not all Parish Councils have a Tree Warden but for many years Chacewater Parish Council has been fortunate to have the benefit of a Tree Warden who gave time freely to help the Council.

Every year, Councillors hold an Annual Meeting in May when officers are elected and Councillors taken on specific responsibilities for areas in which they particularly interested. At this time, also, a Tree Warden is selected.

It will be noted by readers of "What's On in Chacewater" that there has been a lot of activity to do with trees recently, particularly of the felling of dying sycamore at the edge of the river bank by the car park and the sad fall of our Coronation Oak. Chacewater Parish Council feels the needs for expertise when making decisions regarding trees in the future.

There is quite a lot of advice available for the volunteer Parish Tree Warden through Cornwall Council and The Tree Council's Tree Warden Scheme. It was decided to give anyone who might be interested time to find out more about the role, hence this article early in the year. Anyone interested is asked to contact the Parish Clerk [see contact details at the end of the magazine] and we can arrange to meet with you to discuss it.

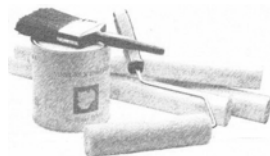

CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY (CROW) WALK

SUNDAY 7th APRIL 2019

There was a specific aim to the April CRoW walk and that was to trek along to see what was being done down at the Twelveheads Play Area, which was recently awarded £5,590.00 refurbishment grant as part of a central government initiative known as “Pocket Park Plus” - more later. First we needed a route and so chose to nip up Church Hill, past the Church of St. Paul’s to the left (brief update Remembrance planning provided) and the animal rehabilitation centre to the right. Following a short breather at the Creegbrowse crossing, we then headed left along the ridge road towards and down into the settlement of Twelveheads itself. 360 degrees of simply stunning heritage scenery that also took in the Geothermal project over at United Downs and a number some recently recovered green pastured areas, how appropriate that the sun peeked out as we transited this stretch of our walk.



The Chacewater Rights of Way walking group take up position on the new tree stump stance that forms part of the – currently being refurbished - Twelveheads Play Park.

On arrival at Twelveheads, we headed straight for the Play Park where a brief was given on the various aspects of the refurbishment P.T.O.

project which, for the benefit of the wider readership, includes:

- Recycling the logs from the 4 overgrown leylandii trees to make several rustic play area stances, such as a mini tree stump walk, a wooden drum set, xylophone and tubular bells!
- Planned installation of an - accessible to all - pedestrian access gate.
- Painting and sprucing up of the existing metal framed apparatus, e.g. swings and goal posts, and the hopeful purchase of a see saw.
- Grassing the area behind the bus shelter, where two picnic tables and park bench will be sited.
- Installing a 6 foot chain link safety fence to the outer perimeter bordering the water courses.
- Revealing the Carnon riverbank - an area of wildlife beauty and under-pinned the funding bid.

Pausing for a photo, it is hoped that most who visited the site on this day will feel moved to pop along in future and inform others so they can share the tranquillity of the river bank scene or just rest in one of the many seats that will soon be available to the passer by.

Time was pressing and so we soon headed back up to Chacewater, encountering some very polite drivers and cyclists along the way, whilst taking in the beauty of our ever changing natural surroundings. A hearty walk in great company and the weather was about as fresh as it needed to be.

The **next CRoW walk** leaves the Square Car Park at **9.30am, Sunday 5th May 2019** - keep trekking!

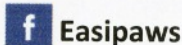

VILLAGE PONDWATCH APRIL 2019



The water remains clear enough to see much new activity below the surface. Newts advance slowly into the shallows then change direction and hide under weed. Four enter a sunny patch, betrayed by shadows as they track across the floor. Newts nest under leaves, waving tails among the weeds. One presses its snout through the green mat like trout rising for a fly.

A Water Stick Insect pushes away from weed banks. Its pale tan colour blends with plant stalks as it patrols the margins. Holding hooked legs ahead and towing a long breathing tail, its streamlined body makes no ripples. The insect swims across open water and passes many tadpoles before it dives back into the weed mass to ambush its prey.

Tadpoles hatched in the last week of March, about 5 weeks after spawn first appeared. Now, hundreds swim freely through open water across the pond. Many thousands gather near the shoreline to graze on decaying vegetation and algae. Their feeding clusters make dark patches among the weeds and seem to bubble as they munch. A single tadpole flounders across a densely packed weed mat while others jostle for front row places in the shoal.

Squads of Whirligig beetles sparkle and swirl across the surface while water boatmen and pondskaters move more stealthily. Lily leaves lie like purple scales on the dark brown water. Overhead, bumblebees and a blue butterfly drift past. A large wasp flies low across the water and meanders noisily around the bank.

Fighting Crime on Your Doorstep

Devon and Cornwall Police have a number of leaflets to help you keep you and your possessions safe.

Chacewater Parish Council has been given a few to reproduce in the parish magazine as space allows. We start with Distraction Burglary - see the following pages

Remember **How to contact the police**

999 Emergency

Where life is threatened, people are injured, offenders are nearby or if immediate action is required.

101 Non-Emergency

If a crime has already happened or to give information about a crime. Calls to 101 only cost 15p from a landline or mobile phone, no matter how long the call lasts. Interpreters are available if required.

What is Distraction Burglary?

Distraction burglary is where criminals call at your house posing as officials or asking for your help with something. They make up a story to get in to your home. Generally targeting older people, they have just one intention: **to steal!**

How do they operate?

- Some work alone, but often they work in groups of two or more, usually one person will knock at your door with a convincing excuse that seems genuine or urgent
- The talker will persuade you to let them into your house and keep you occupied whilst others sneak in and search your house to steal cash and valuables
- They can be men, women or children and sometimes a combination, smartly or casually dressed.

Remember

A genuine caller will happily wait outside while you check on them by calling their organisation and or calling a family member or neighbour.

Distraction Burglary isn't common but we must all remain vigilant!

Although the number of distraction burglaries is nowhere near the number of other crimes committed in the UK each day,

every police force does take this crime very seriously. We all work together with a national police unit called Operation Liberal, set up to help catch the criminals who carry out these dreadful crimes. We've been very successful too! Distraction burglaries are falling and we are catching more criminals and sending them to prison for longer spells than ever before – but with your help we want to stamp them out completely.

If you suspect a bogus caller is at your door call 999. The police are never too busy to attend even if it turns out to be a false alarm. Police would rather attend a false alarm than not be called to a distraction burglary.

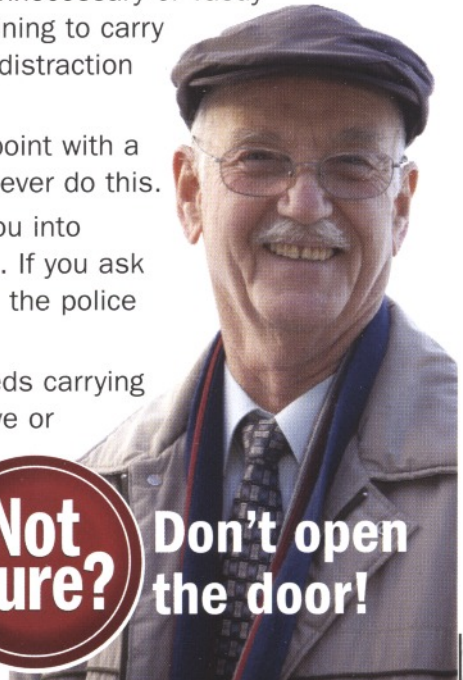
Rogue traders

Rogue traders call at your door and offer to do work on your home or garden that will be either unnecessary or vastly over-priced. They have no formal training to carry out the work. Some have links with distraction burglars

- Don't ever go to a bank or cash point with a trader; legitimate traders would never do this.
- Don't allow anyone to pressure you into agreeing to have work carried out. If you ask them to leave and they don't, call the police dial 999.
- Do discuss any work you feel needs carrying out on your property with a relative or friend who can help you find a reputable trader.
- Don't agree to any work or sign anything on the spot.



**Don't open
the door!**



Common lies distraction burglars use to convince you to let them in:

“**“I’m from the “Water Board”, there’s a leak down the road I need to check your water supply”**

This will never be true. The phrase “water board” is no longer used by legitimate callers – only distraction burglars. Don’t open the door. Even if they say “It’s an emergency”. Your water supplier can easily be contacted to verify any caller – their number can be found on your water bill and directory enquiries. If they continue to insist you open the door, tell them you’re going to call the police on 999 – and do it!

“I need to read your meter”

Check with your utility company before you let them in. Call your electricity, gas or water company direct. Use the telephone number from a recent bill or from your local directory. You may also be able to join your utility provider’s password scheme.

“We are the police, we’ve caught a burglar, we think he’s stolen your cash and we need to check your money is safe”

Genuine police officers **never do this**. Don’t let them in. Some distraction burglars actually break in to your home then tell you they’re the police “looking for a burglar”. If you find anyone already in your home who says they’re from the police, they won’t be. Call the real police on 999 straight away.

”

In an emergency situation always call 999

A few tips to keep you safe

- If you're not sure who is at your door, don't open it! Check the identity of the caller by calling the company they are purporting to be from ie. Gas, Electricity, Water or Police. Use the telephone numbers listed in your local directory or provided independently by your service provider. **Do not use any telephone numbers provided by the caller, they may be bogus.**
- Telephone a neighbour or friend nearby to come along and check out the caller before you open the door to them.
- Some areas in the country have Neighbourhood Watch or Nominated Neighbour Schemes you can sign up to. Check with your local police Safer Neighbourhood Team to find out if there is one in your area.
- Many utility service providers like Gas Electricity and Water, provide password schemes or hotline numbers for customers to call, to check the identity of callers before opening the door. Speak to your utility provider.
- Don't keep large quantities of cash at home; put it in the bank or post office where it is safe.
- Keep doors locked and windows secure at all times. Only put the door chain on to answer the door.
- If somebody asks for your help, needs to make a telephone call, has lost a ball in your garden, needs a drink or request a pen and paper for example, refer them to a younger neighbour or assist them through a closed door. Or call a friend or neighbour to come and assist.
- If you suspect a bogus caller has visited you, even if you didn't let them in, call the police straight away.
We need to know!
