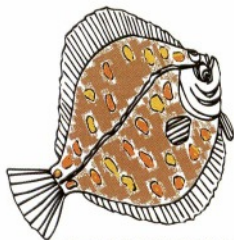

We now have had confirmation of our delivery of the vaccines for patients over the age of 65.

Due to the delivery schedule for these vaccinations we will have to alter our system for giving these to ensure that we have enough for all our eligible patients.

We will be contacting these patients inviting them to specific organised clinics. Invitations will be going out soon and the clinics will be held in November.

If patients are unable to attend their chosen clinic then alternative arrangements can be made.

We will be requesting patients to bring their invitation letters with them to the clinics. Although these clinics are for invited patients, there will not be appointments slots so that patients can attend at their convenience between the hours advertised.

Eligible patients under the age of 65 will also be vaccinated at these clinics and will be able to attend whichever date is convenient for them. Please contact the surgery for the clinic dates and times.

## GLOBAL PONDWATCH OCTOBER 2018



September storms topped-up the pond and left the water much clearer. Visibility is good to a depth of 15-20cm as sediment settles. A newt may be seen to surface occasionally while leaves start to fall. When the wind drops, the dark water reflects surrounding trees. A water stick insect steadily works thread-like legs, paddling towards a floating leaf. Beetles make small rings of ripples that quickly fade as passing birds cross the mirrored pond.

Two ravens fly past and catch a thermal air current. They soar high above the village and drift out of sight beyond Wheal Busy downs. A russet red moth darts across the water and dragonflies continue to visit and lay their eggs. Wasps and several butterflies still feast on the remains of a heavy crop of blackberries.

As copy deadline approaches, on the far side of the world, a dark secret pond lies at the foot of a high sandstone quarry cut by convict labour from the Port Arthur penal colony. Hidden by overhanging grasses an unknown creature makes a deep, reverberating alarm call. Two loud notes echo eerily – “Boi-ing...BOI-INNGG”. Further north, swallows fly over Lake Macquarie – a body of water rather larger than all of Chacewater parish. Now, in the Australian Capital Territory, at the heart of the capital city is Lake Burley Griffin – where horse leeches lie in wait for paddling mammals.

## IN MEMORIAM

November 11<sup>th</sup> this year marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Armistice ending the 1<sup>st</sup> World War fighting in 1918. While serving in the armed forces, some 30 men of Chacewater lost their lives in that war. Their graves lie in Africa, in Asia and across Europe. Many joined up locally or elsewhere in England. Others came back from Australia, from South Africa or North America. Their stories may be told more fully in the future. Here, in remembrance, we record the names of those who fell as each month brought sad news of their death to Chacewater families.

# JENNY'S GARDEN PATCH ~ NOVEMBER

Now that November has arrived it is the time to prepare your garden for the coldest months.

It's still not too late to plant bulbs to bring spring colour to your garden and add that extra colour to your tubs and containers whether it is dwarf tulips in reds, yellows or bi-colours, dwarf daffs, crocus or snowdrops. Remember bulbs are good value as they come up year after year.



## TREES

Trees add structure to the landscape and garden. There are all types, shapes and sizes. From flowering cherries and crab apples to evergreen yews, there are trees to suit every taste and position

imaginable. Trees offer different leaf size, shape and colour and many have attractive flowers, fruits and seeds. There are those that flower magnificently in spring to those whose leaves offer brilliant autumn colour just before leaf fall. Trees can be selected for all soil types including very wet and dry land. They can tolerate acidic, chalky, sandy and clay soils. They even make up soils in new gardens or landscapes.



Some trees make excellent hedges and screens whilst others make ideal specimens set in the middle of a lawn. The choice is yours.

All trees require some support and protection such as stakes, tree ties and tree guards. Fertiliser can be added to the planting hole and mulch can be added after planting to preserve moisture and keep down weeds.

Trees are best planted in the autumn, especially bare rooted varieties. Container grown trees can be planted at any time of the year providing the soil / ground is not frozen or water logged.

Malus and Prunus, Betula and Sorbus are good choices for the average gardener who has a little space in their garden.

## NOVEMBER IN THE GARDEN

- Clear leaves and compost them
- Sow peas and broad beans
- Spike lawn and give it an autumn feed
- Protect tender outdoor plants from frost
- Roses need very little attention this month – just make sure they're all tidied up for the winter.
- November is a good time of year to plant new hedges. You'll see bundles of bare-rooted hedging plants in garden centres now.
- Tidy up the borders by clearing old stems and dead foliage. Not everything needs to be cut down – many ornamental grasses will look fabulous through the winter, especially when frosted
- As long as the ground is not too waterlogged or frozen you can plant herbaceous perennials, shrubs, deciduous trees, roses and fruit trees. Finish planting pansies, wallflowers, forget-me-nots and primulas
- Give the greenhouse a good wash down and clean up prior to insulating if you intend to use it through the winter. Decrease ventilation but do give the greenhouse a good airing on fine days to stop disease developing and especially downy mildew

That's all for this month, have a great month in your gardens weather permitting.

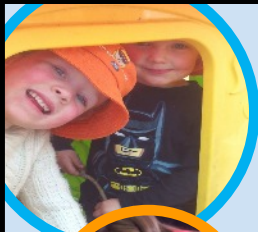

## **CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY (CROW) WALK** **SUNDAY 7th OCTOBER 2018**

How lucky we are! The early part of Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup> October was wonderfully bright, very still, became increasingly warm and sat between two particularly poor weather days – just right for a well-paced walk. So, off the CRoW walking group (which included new friends Stephen and June Dixon from Northumberland) trekked as usual from the car park at 9.30am, crossing Fore Street opposite the King's Head and on towards Riverside where we walked threequarters the way along its course on Bronze Public Footpath (Public Right of Way (PRoW)) 301/65/1.

Turning sharp right and onto PRoW 301/66/1, having first negotiated the ensuing style we were met by the glorious sight of the maize fields heavy with Corn kernels through which the diagonal route took us up on PRoW 301/17/1-2 before reaching Kea Downs Road near Tamblins Barn and the Weak Bridge.

Navigating the Weak Bridge area on Kea Downs most carefully (not so busy on a Sunday morn, but still busy enough!) we ambled off along PRoW 301/30/2 past Springfield before linking with 301/21/1 and 28/2 beside Willow House and Penstraze Farm. Just opposite the Bronze PRoW 301/29/1 (which must be re-opened over the winter as it connects with wood and wetland!), we turned sharp left along the straight Gold PRoW 301/29/2 route that meets up with Kea Downs Road once more – what a glorious panoramic view one gets at this particular point!

So, after a goodly pause, we headed left again for about 100 metres before departing the Kea Downs Road off right and back down towards Chacewater village via Bronze routes 301/67/1 and 2. Crossing the railway track – a terrific vantage point at which to see the Flying Scotsman the previous day - before connecting with Gold PRoW routes 301/20/2 and 301/20/4 down into Jollys Bottom, we eventually emerged out onto Station Road and entered the village once more down along the delightful Riverside.

Back in the car park by 11.00 o'clock, with such good chat, lovely company, great weather and underfoot conditions, all agreed that this route should come highly recommended.

The **next CRoW** walk will leave the Square Car Park at **9.30am** on Sunday **4th November 2018**. Don't forget the **cornwalltrails.net** website for other walks in the area – they are just 3 of many!

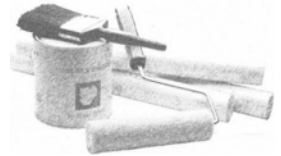
