It is worth remembering that this only happens due to the hard work of the volunteers who give their time freely. If you fancy joining them I know your help would be welcomed.

On the following weekend, we have the opportunity to remember the sacrifice of previous generations in wars which allows us to enjoy the way of life we might just take for granted. The **Remembrance Day** service and the laying of wreaths is always a moving moment in the passing of the year. Poppies will again decorate many parts of the village, to show our respect.

As the dark nights take over, Chacewater Players are hard at work rehearsing for this year's **Pantomime**, "Cinderella" which will be performed in January next year.

It has been over a month since the resurfacing and new speed limit was introduced to the centre of the village and it seems to be working in reducing the speed of the traffic through the main street. On the whole most people seem to think it has made a difference for the better.

Although not popular with some, **Community Speedwatch** volunteers continue to undertake random sessions, to keep drivers on their toes. We will never get total compliance but if the average speed drops from the mid-thirties to the mid-twenties, that makes an enormous difference, especially if someone were unlucky enough to get run down. As the national 'Twenty's Plenty' campaign gets rolled out in more and more villages and towns, maybe attitudes will change to a slower pace in built up areas.

# CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY WALKING (CROW) GROUP

**SUNDAY 2<sup>ND</sup> OCTOBER 2022**

They say “the sun shines on the righteous” don’t they? Well, the days before and the hours either side of the CRoW walk on Sunday the 2<sup>nd</sup> October, were very overcast indeed and rain was predicted. So, we mustered in the car park ready for the “worst case” weather scenario but – as usually seems to be the case – we didn’t really need to worry. Not a drop of the damp stuff fell, in fact the sun came out in all its glory for most of this lengthy but hopefully interesting and enjoyable walk, which took us to parts west, north and south of the Parish!

**The Route.** These 16 trekkers set off up Church Hill (via the Millennium Green footpath of course), passed St Paul’s – taking the first of a few breathers – the grand entrance to Chacewater House and beyond, to a point half way up the hill where we turned right off the road onto Byway 51/1. This took us about 100 yards along a good track before linking to the left and along Bridleway 51/2, keeping High View Farm to the left. About 5 minutes later we connected – *at a particularly muddy spot* – with Bridleway 52/1 which takes you left and eventually out to a mini crossroad opposite the old Count House, (roughly 50 yards from the larger Creegbrowse Crossing). Pause taken at this metalled road junction, then we headed off right – taking in some

stunning views towards St Day, Carn Brea and beyond along all the way - to reach Cox Hill junction, which sees Truro Tractors off to the right

Crossing this busy road junction in good order, we soon picked up Bridleway 13/2 off to the left. This particular pathway takes you past the wonderful new build Cox Hill Farm, all the way down and across another metalled road (and some apple trees) near Wheal Bush and the adjacent Unity Mine Engine Houses, to the track of the Coast-to-Coast Tramway, which is marked by a series of signed granite blocks.



Turning right for about 25 yards only, our return leg started in Unity Woods and an area that was heavily coppiced about 3 years back at the behest of Tregothnan Estates. At that time, there were many questions as to why this was being done at all? Well, take a look at the place now, because an area that was previously dying in terms of habitat, tree growth, etc. is now

transformed. It is full of life and has 100 times more healthy oak trees than it had before. A real treat which hopefully everyone now appreciates!

After this particular briefing point and a wonderfully natural playground area - which was enjoyed by the younger element of our group this day - we went up and into the depths of Unity Woods proper, where the pathway eventually took us to the outstandingly tall Killifreth Mine Engine House. Pausing once more to focus on what Tregothnan Estates had achieved in terms of making the surrounding area safe for all users, we soon hope to locate a picnic table here for anyone to rest and enjoy.

Moving on, we transited along and across the very busy Scorrier to Chacewater road, passed Fay's Caravan and Camping Park to the left and down along Bridleways 1/15, 1/5 and 5/2 to Wheal Busy, before heading back down into the village via Hillside Farm and so along Byways 63/1 to 3. Now out onto The Terrace and saying goodbye to some folk near Sergeants Hill, we eventually arrived back at the Main Square Car Park at 1130. All in all, a very healthy 2 hours of enjoyment to start the Sunday.....well it was halfway through the day by the time we got back! Enjoyed by all and some old and new acquaintances made, we could certainly all justify our Sunday Lunch on this occasion!

# WHAT WILL THEY BE UP TO...

At certain times of the year it is not so much about what has happened as what will happen. When we highlight news in this section it is almost always about members of our community giving their time to voluntarily do things to make our Parish a little better.

This month we are looking at ways that you can get involved – adding to the regular events that brighten up our village in the winter months.

The first of these is our annual **firework extravaganza** – making a welcome return this year on November 5<sup>th</sup> – we need volunteers to help build the bonfire on the morning of the 5<sup>th</sup> and staff our catering tables. We are planning to run our burger and sweet stalls, as in previous years, and extra hands are always welcome here or with the clearing up afterwards (not as arduous as you might think but still has to be done).

Following swiftly on, we will be putting up the re-useable poppy decorations to commemorate Remembrance Day. This will be done during week commencing 7<sup>th</sup> November and help is always appreciated.

Finally, a little bit of forward planning, the Christmas trees will be going up on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December. This is made a whole lot easier with many helpers as the trees have to be dressed with lights before they can actually be distributed. There will be some new sets of lights this year and we will be asking residents along the main road

if they would be happy to ‘host’ a tree again this year, we never underestimate how important these households are in making our village look so good for Christmas.

## NEWS FROM YOUR COMMUNITY GARDEN

Autumn seems to have crept in gently this year, but its presence has been reflected in our activities at the community garden. We’ve been clearing away finished crops, giving the beds some TLC and have started autumnal planting of garlic, broad beans and winter lettuce. The bubble wrap greenhouse has also needed some work to shore it up for winter.

We have been busy with the first of our autumn projects - the orchard and wildflower meadow. Having cleared away turf and weeds, lifted and replanted flower bulbs, we’ve got the area sown, and put up newspaper bird scarers. We’ve also started weaving circular fences in which flowers and grasses for dry flower arranging will be grown. We are after a bit of help in sourcing supplies for these woven planting pockets. So, if you are pruning back anything long, whippy and flexible - like willow or cornus / dogwood, perhaps you could consider

dropping them off at the shed. Thank you.

It's been lovely to see that word is beginning to spread about the produce stand! As well as plants and packets of collected seed we've been able to supply a small selection of fresh seasonal vegetables. We advertise what vegetables are available on the stand each week on our Facebook page. Currently you'll



find winter bedding plants, perfect for filling that empty gap or to create a colourful planter which you can admire through the window from the warmth and comfort of your sofa! There are also fruit plants including strawberries, raspberries and rhubarb, which are perfect for planting in Autumn. Alongside this (in the boxes at the bottom of the stand) is a range of homemade preserves including



chutneys, savoury apple sauce (perfect with Sunday roast), and jams. Donations can be posted into the shed letterbox, so feel free to pop by whenever you want and pay what you wish.

Over the coming month we'll be starting work on our next project, which is an expansion of the cut flower area and redesign of the herb bed. This should give a real 'garden' feel to the top terrace as we are planning a more informal walk through from the wildflower meadow, edged by colourful flowers and shrubs to span the seasons.

We are finalising plans for a get-together to mark the winter solstice on the 21<sup>st</sup> of December. Weather permitting, we hope to have a log burning in the firepit and serve hot chocolate with seasonal bakes, more details will be available in next month's What's On but make a note in your diary if you would like to join us.

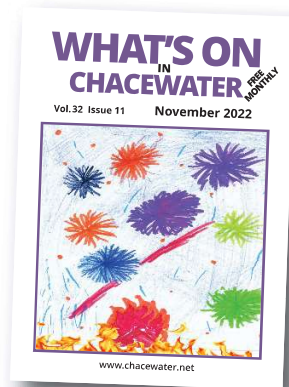

# ROAD SAFETY



It's been a bit of a wait but hopefully by the time this article is read we will have had six Street Planters delivered and installed, secured the finance and found the volunteers to make them an attractive and effective piece of our recent Road Safety (RS) Streetscape jigsaw. The planters were seen as a key part of the scheme identified through public consultation. They will help to define and protect permitted on-street parking areas.

By way of reminding us all as to why these particular items of street furniture are required, we are still seeing – *every day* – many cases of local vehicle users parking in most inconsiderate and often dangerous ways. Such problems continue despite:-

- the clarity of the new road markings;

- usually there being well over 20 empty parking bays overnight in the Main Square car park;
- and a further 30 empty parking bays up at the Community Car Park above our school;

So, something has to be done to make things safer for all and this is just one method that we have been advised might help. Once again, residents are asked to show a little patience as these assets – which were supported by the majority of the community - settle into the wider RS plan for Chacewater.

**Further Poor Parking** is causing significant concern near the junction at **Kerley Vale** leading out onto Kerley Hill as well as The Terrace where it meets Sergeants Hill. Parking close to the Kerley Vale junction creates a very dangerous 'blind spot' out onto a busy

road and restricts visibility at a point where very many of our Primary School children cross it. On the other hand, parking at **The Terrace/Sergeants Hill junction** causes significant narrowing of an already restricted width roadway, which is used by over 30 householders; it also restricts any sizeable delivery or emergency vehicle from accessing this part of the village. Signs have now been placed at both locations to remind folk of **Highway Code Rule 243**, which states that vehicles should not park within 10 metres of a junction. **Traffic Enforcement Officers** are now undertaking more frequent patrols of the village and will be issuing tickets - but should it really come to this?

# ERNEST EDWARD (EDDY) DUNSTAN



My father Eddy Dunstan was born in Probus, one of five children. He was employed as a cashier by Truro Rural District Council until his early death in 1972. As there was no office in those days, he would drive round in his car to collect rent and rates.

Eddy was called up during World War II and served in the Home Guard. My mother took over the rent collecting so as to keep the job open for him until his return.

When I was a child, I remember my father playing cricket for Chacewater. On one occasion he came home with a broken nose when a cricket ball hit his face. I thought his nose had disappeared!

This photo of Chacewater Cricket Club in 1939 shows my father, Eddy Dunstan (*front row, 3rd from right*). He was a great sportsman who played snooker, billiards, cricket and football. As a young man he was "head-hunted" and went with his brother Reggie to play football in Canada. He played several seasons for a mining company team before coming back to Chacewater.

Sadly, Eddy died in November 1972 when he was only 62 years old.

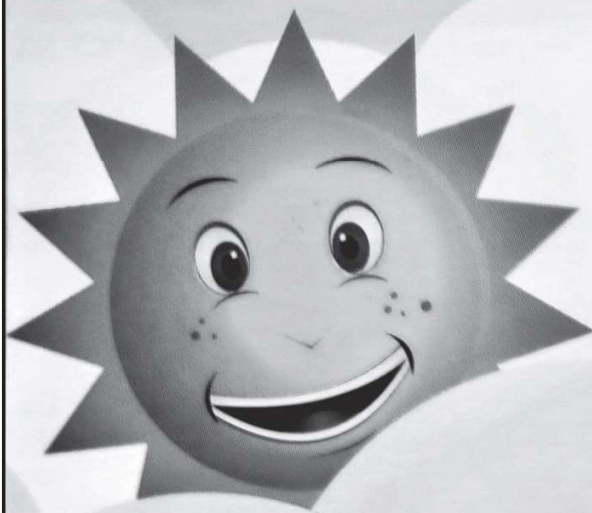

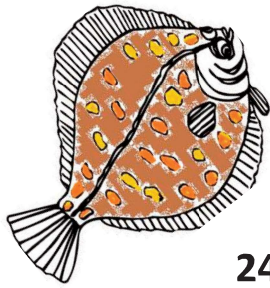

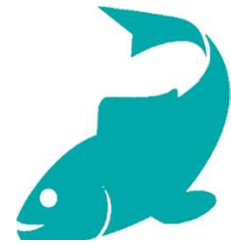

# VILLAGE PONDWATCH OCTOBER 2022

Autumn drags damply around the pond. Foliage begins to fade on surrounding plants and leaves fall from trees. In the water, long green fingers of parrot's feather weed stretch out from three sides. The air cools during the first week of October, but two male darter dragonflies continue to bicker over the sunlit half of the pond.

A male Southern Hawker dragonfly also keeps hunting at low level over the water and along the banks. He flies high into the ash tree where his colours perfectly match the dark branches, yellow/green leaves and patches of bright blue sky.



Down below, the water is dark and still as pondskaters run tracklessly across it. Between the lily pads, small water beetles make occasional

ripples. Once, like an eel beneath the surface, a long silver/grey shape appeared to rush from the middle of the pond towards the far bank. The illusion proved to be a squirrel, mirrored as it bounded down a tree trunk opposite.

A little wren scoots across the water and hides in a willow bush, whence sparrows and a great tit fly in long waves into the trees. In afternoon



sunshine small gnats and caddis flies drift above the water. Every day, wasps may be seen searching through the brambles and other plants. Nearby, two Red Admiral butterflies take off and race over the grass before seeking shelter from the damp air.

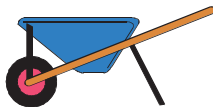

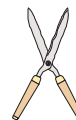
