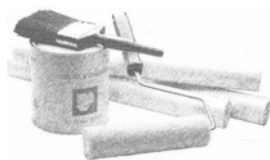

Please note, the first clinic on 2nd Oct is for patients over 65 only. This is due to the supplier's delivery schedules for the under 65 vaccines and is beyond our control.

To ensure that we can provide the quickest and safest service on the day please can we ask that patients do not arrive earlier than the start time of the clinic as we are unable to give any vaccinations until a Doctor is at the hall.

The clinics can be very busy early on so, if possible, please arrive later in the clinic so that everyone can be seen in a timely manner and you have a shorter wait.

There will be representatives from our Patient Participation Group and also our Social Prescriber at each clinic to discuss any suggestions or comments patients may have regarding the surgery and the services we provide.

For patients under 65, we are really pleased to be able to offer the upgraded flu jab which provides broader cover against flu and protection against 4 possible flu strains rather than the 3 offered in previous years.

Please note that we will not be able to offer patients appointments for their flu jabs at the surgery until the last flu clinic has taken place.

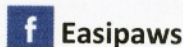

The Sad Passing of Two Former Parish Councillors and Stalwarts of The Chacewater Community

It is with much sadness that the last month saw the passing of two former Parish Councillors and real community contributors in Mark Buckingham and David Firth.

Mark was a councillor between 2003 to 2016, chaired the Village Carnival for many years and was integral to the annual Bonfire night and Christmas celebrations. The School caretaker, he loved his sport and cricket was his passion; as a member of Stithians Cricket Club his influence stretched well beyond Chacewater. A Cornishman through and through, Mark was always there to help and contributed a great deal down the years through his deep understanding of what was required in and around the Parish at grass roots level.

David was also a key contributor to parish affairs and beyond. A councillor from 2013 to 2017 and member of both the Mining Villages Regeneration Group and Truro and Roseland Community Network Panel in that time. He brought a high degree of intellectual rigour to anything he became involved in. A Humanist, Oxfam volunteer, active supporter of the Green Party and lecturer at Cornwall College and Falmouth University, he was a proud Yorkshireman of huge understanding who gave terrific support to so many others.

Both Mark and David will be very sadly missed by the Chacewater community, especially as they each gave so much and asked for nothing in return.

Chacewater “Streetscaping” **Old Market Public Consultation**

After extensive surveys of significant parts of the village area, members of Highways England (HE) and Arup (their sub-contractor) introduced the community to the processes they had followed at a public consultation event, in the Old Market on Wednesday 11th September.

All part of how the core of the village might be shaped in future to make it a safer place to be and even more community orientated, the event made for a very useful exchange of views and ideas about how the ‘Streetscape’ of the village might look over a 2 to 10 year (and beyond) timeframe and was very well attended by over 70 residents over 2 hour period. A further consolidation meeting with the Arup and Chacewater Parish Team took place the following morning, which focused on more localised detail, some wider thinking and future planning/timelines.

Directly linked to the wider HE Designated Funding apportioned to Chacewater, due to its proximity to the A30 dual carriageway initiative, it is hoped that a further Public Event will be held prior to Christmas to explain more about what is being considered for this and the other initiatives planned for our area, which include:

- The stabilization of the Old Smithy up at Wheal Busy.
- The Cornwall Wildlife Site (CWS) wetland area, just south of the A30.

These are potentially exciting times for Chacewater village and the surrounding area and we need therefore to maximise this opportunity to engage with an equally enthusiastic ARUP and Highways England Team

Local Government News.

Dear Reader

Chacewater Parish Council is working well and making good progress with the “Parish Development Plan” and we must all congratulate them for this difficult task which is about the long-term future of the whole Parish.

A Cornwall Council issue, which is causing some concern, is the collection of households refuse fortnightly, but the recycling will be collected weekly. The worry for many householders is insufficient storage to store waste etc. for up to two weeks and especially in hot weather.

What had taken a lot of my time recently is the famous” Shute” which of course was the village water supply until 1955. To any resident who has not been near the site recently, the usual trouble is that there has been too much water and most years I have had to get the Council staff to clear the exit pipes to let the water flow into the nearby river. However, at present the water is not running at all. There is only a slow drip of water from it now. It seems that the pipework and the receptive tank behind the actual ”Shute” is clogged with and other material preventing the flow of water. So, as I started to make enquiries and talked to many longer term residents everyone agrees that “Shute” has never run dry even in particularly dry and drought like summers.

I next phoned Council Officers at Scorrier and asked them to cut the vegetation around the ”Shute” and to reinstate the water, the answer I received was yes they will tidy the vegetation but their agreement is to deal with flooding issues and too much water but not the problem we have at the moment!

Next I spoke with Mr Richard Northey who turned up as a volunteer complete with his drain rods and started prodding around to find much root and other debris but still no water.

I am so grateful to so many long term residents for their enthusiasm, interest and helpful knowledge. But my concern is that it seems to me to need the cooperation of the people who own the gardens behind the “Shute” and then doing the physical work. The cost of which will need to be worked out – however more of that in a future edition of “What’s On”.



Chacewater Rights Of Way (CRoW) Walk

Sunday 1st September 2019

The first of the new 2019-2020 season of Chacewater Right of Way (CRoW) walks coincided with some ideal walking conditions. Not too sunny, a bit of a breeze and sound underfoot, following a couple of announcements we 16 enthusiasts stepped out from the car park in a northerly direction shortly after 9.30am, as usual, on the first Sunday of the month.

A relatively simple walk this one, we crossed Fore Street (via the pedestrian crossing of course!), headed along Station Road and turned left along The Terrace before heading up Wheal Busy Lane. Turning right before Hillside Farm, up along Bridleway 301/5/3 through the lovely horse/walk friendly gate, we soon came out onto the splendour that is Wheal Busy Downs from where we could see for miles around. Pausing for a moment of reflection, we

headed off to turn left along 301/5/3 (passing the Cornwall Observatory on the right) before taking the Bridleway 301/62/1. Hitting the road that comes up from the old Railway Station at this junction, we turned left across the crossroad and on towards the Wheal Busy Chapel along Byway 301/39/1 that loops around Boscawan Farm. Left turn, we headed back towards Wheal Busy along the old miners' trail on Byway 301/2/4 and Bridleways 301/60/2 and 60/1 (a bit more Japanese Knotweed identified) which brought us out near Duckworths.

Off to the right and down the road towards the Old Smithy for a chat about its future stabilisation, we returned to the village via Wheal Busy Lane, where we paused once again for a photo opportunity at one of the favoured of all views with Chacewater Church in the distant background.

Most enjoyable loop of a trek, this walk took in the four main features described in the Local Landscape Character Assessment (LLCA) of the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) - notably: Elevated Plateaus, the Rolling Intermediate countryside, Steep sided Valleys and the Valley Bottom itself – we also got back to the car park on time!!

IN MEMORIAM

Pte. **John Leonard SKINNER**, Royal Fusiliers, 26th Btn.

Died **OCT 4th 1916**

John Leonard Skinner was the first-born and only son of Henry and Elizabeth Skinner. He was born in 1891 and grew up in Wheal Rose House with his three younger sisters. John's grandparents, also Henry and Elizabeth, were quite prosperous and lived on Buckingham Terrace in Chacewater. Henry Skinner senior had been a successful Mine Agent and, in retirement, farmed 40 acres.

His only son, Henry, took over the farm as a young man. On 17th May 1888, Henry married Elizabeth Davey, a 22 year-old "bal-maiden", at St Day. Within 10 years Elizabeth (Bessie) Skinner bore her 4th child, Ethel. 5 years later, John Leonard was 12 years old when his mother died in October 1903, aged just 37 years. During the next 5 years John helped with family and the farm until his father re-married (Margaret Wilson) in January 1908. Aged 17, John L. Skinner had a short walk from the house to Scorrier Station where he took a train to London. In the capital, John found lodgings with the Bolding family in North Kensington. He settled into employment as a clerk with a legal firm in the City.

Early in August 1914, John L. Skinner joined the Royal Fusiliers, City of London Regiment and was enrolled in the 10th ("Stockbroker's") Battalion (no: 2346). This unit joined the B.E.F. in France in July 1915 and served on the Western Front with the 37th Division. At the same time, the 26th (Banker's) Battalion, Royal Fusiliers was formed by the Lord Mayor and

City of London. Having trained in Aldershot, in May 1916 they went to France with the 41st Division.

Throughout July 1916, the 10th Battalion was “loaned” to the 34th Division and engaged in battles around Albert, at Pozières and Bazentin Ridge. Experienced Pte. John L. Skinner was transferred to the 26th Battalion (XV Corps) and served with that unit as the Somme battles continued into Autumn. Between 15 – 22 September, they fought along Thiepval ridge in the battle of Flers-Courcelette. Advancing a few kilometres eastward, despite bitter cold and heavy rain in the first week of October, XV Corps waded through freezing mud to fight in the battle of Le Transloy.

Pte. John Leonard Skinner was killed in action on 4th October 1916. His body was never recovered or identified. His name is commemorated on the nearby Thiepval memorial and the Chacewater War Memorial.

A Message From Rev. Richard Wallis

As a Priest, I'm asked the same question time and again, how do you know that God exists?

It's a good question. For me, knowledge is something that is known, I have all the information to make sense of that object. Whereas, when I

don't have the information or understanding, I choose to believe, accepting something to be so. In everyday life it's noticeable how much belief is needed.

Let me give you one example. I have one of those smart phones. Through this device I can contact anyone in the world, send photos, videos and even make phone calls. I have access to a wealth of knowledge and experience, who has not used YouTube to learn something new?

When I pick it up, I'm believing in the designers, engineers and testers. When using the phone, I am believing in those managing the networks. Only when the phone does not work is my belief in the device and those people betrayed, leaving me confused and frustrated. I'm left without any doubt about what I do not know and what is simply belief.

How do I know that God exists? My lack of knowledge and understanding about God can be overwhelming at times. Yet I make a choice to believe that God does exist, informed by my own personal experience of God in my life. Within my life are others who also believe in God and share their own experiences. I have informed belief, one that is continually being tested and amended as I journey on. God only asks us to believe in him, without all the information or facts, making a choice. I choose to believe in God, who takes delight in us, who loves us as we are. I choose to believe that he delights and loves you too. Will you choose to believe in God? Will you choose to find out for yourself, to inform your own belief?

In response I ask the same question, how do you know that God does not exist?

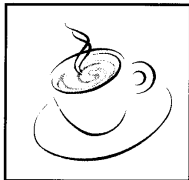

VILLAGE PONDWATCH SEPTEMBER 2019



Bramble banks, interlaced with many more soft-stemmed plants, surround the pond. Behind, a tall Ash tree holds its dark green leaves, while edges curl on Sycamore leaves turned dusty brown. Hawthorns bear a heavy crop of rich red berries and round, yellowing, leaves begin to fall from the Aspen trees.

Wasps feast on ripe blackberries and small carder bees work among purple loosestrife flowers. Pearl grey gnats drift in sunlit air. A large water lily has appeared beside a mass of hornwort, oxygenating weed, in the water. Now, nine-tenths of the pond is covered with weed and lily pads. Slight winds and water boatmen shiver the surface where patches are clear of plant growth. Water stick insects lurk by the weeds, breathe through tail siphons and swim away searching for prey.



In stiffening breezes, fewer blue damselflies take to the air but some pairs cling to floating plants. A large black and golden-ringed dragonfly hangs on a bramble leaf, clasping a ripening fruit. Later, smaller red darters defend their territories and mated pairs lay eggs in the water.

Bigger, stronger dragonflies stay longer on patrol. For more than 30 minutes a Common Hawker cruises above the pond, chasing off another male that swoops down from the trees. Over two days, a bright green and black-banded female Southern Hawker hunts regularly. The following week, a



male Southern Hawker arrives. With his apple-green striped body, black and blue banded tail, he repeatedly circles and quarters the area.

On sloping grassland above the pond, two green woodpeckers feed on ants. They fly to a nest in large trees beside the churchyard. A rangy black feral cat gallops towards her lair in a far corner of the Green; her paws drum the baked earth beneath fresh-cut grass.

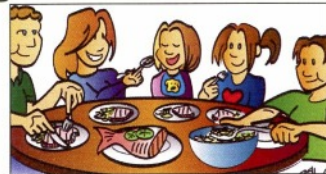
