A lovely sunny day which saw a number of local residents turn out and enjoy a good chat with Sarah, John and some of those who had driven this project through, in her own words our MP said:

“This is exactly what the Pocket Parks Plus initiative was aimed at providing and this is indeed a terrific example of what can be achieved by a few committed individuals from across the community. You have done a fabulous job. It is thoughtful, inspiring, has both the environment and residents at its heart. I am most impressed by the imagination of those who have made this happen. It is something for everyone and I note in particular just how much material has been recycled to make such artistic play equipment. May I therefore, on all your behalves, just say a huge thank you to everyone involved in refurbishing this area, which has so much potential”

### **Planned Change to Repeat Prescription Collection Times From Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2019**

As you may already be aware from the national news, a large amount of medication is becoming more difficult to obtain, including items which are prescribed regularly.

The shortages often mean we have to contact numerous different suppliers to source medication or are having to supply alternative suitable options so that we can fulfil patient requests.

To aid our dispensary team with the difficult task of obtaining these medicines we have made the decision to extend the period of time needed between repeat prescription requests and when they will be ready to collect.

This time-frame is currently 48 working hours but from Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2019 we will be extending this to 72 working hours to allow the time needed to continue providing the high quality of patient care and support. Please rest assured that all medication requests will be dealt with as efficiently as possible and any emergency situations or on the day requirements will, as always, be supported to the best of our abilities.

If you have any concerns or issues about this we would ask that you contact our dispensary team who can discuss this with you.

Please use the timetable opposite for guidance when ordering your medication.

Repeat requests are dealt with between the hours of 8.30am and 4.30pm. If you order after 4.30pm it will be counted as received the next working day.

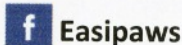

## Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) Incident Reporting Locals Trained



We're Watching You!

Consistent with other parishes, some aspects of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) continue to blight some areas in and around Chacewater; in this regard we are referring mainly to instances of Dog Fouling, Littering, Fly Tipping, Graffiti and Vandalism. Fully recognised by Cornwall Council, Towns and Parishes across the county have agreed to help as much as they can to eradicate such problems. Cornwall Council's Community Protection Team has therefore recently conducted a series of training courses that now allow ***“Designated Persons”*** within Town and Parish communities to report ***any observed instances*** of ASB via a simple ***Incident Report Card system***.

Essentially, the ASB Incident Report Card will be viewed as a formal witness statement and sent to Cornwall Council. Once received and checked for accuracy the information contained on the card will allow the Community Protection Team to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN). For information, the FPN charges are as follows:

- £150.00 for Littering
- £100.00 for Dog Fouling
- £400.00 for Fly-Tipping

If taken to court, the above sums are considerably more, so in almost all cases to date the recipients of the FPN pay - but the reporter should be willing to attend court if it needed.


The Parish Council receives many complaints about Dog Fouling, Littering, Fly Tipping, bits of Graffiti and Vandalism, so it is keen to do something about it. So, some **“Designated Persons”** from Chacewater have now been trained in completing the Incident Report Cards – they are anonymous and that’s for good reason.

Residents will also soon see a few more notices - like that seen above and below – at known areas of ASB around the Parish. All about stopping those few thoughtless individuals from within our own community from spoiling it for others, we hope the community welcomes such initiative!!

## **Local Government News.**

Dear Reader

It is always good to deal with positive news and to start yesterday, as I write, a tree that had fallen blocking the path that goes from Boscawen Road to Kerley Hill was cleared up. Thanks to the person that did that. It would be of even more benefit if people refrained from dumping lawn mower clippings and others throwing bottles and drink cans into the lane on the side of the path only for the Parish Council to have to pay somebody to collect these for disposal on a regular basis.

Changing the subject slightly we have had recently, on a field gateway near our home, rubbish dumped that will cost the Ratepayer (that is you and us) money for it to be collected and removed. Why do people do this? Littering our countryside when it is so easy to dump rubbish easily, responsibly and without cost. I just cannot understand this happening, but if ever you see this irresponsible behaviour there is no need to get involved in an argument, merely record their vehicle registration number and tell any Parish or Cornwall Council Member and they will do the rest. We need to make their offence public knowledge to stop more of these situations happening in the future.

A very friendly afternoon was held Tweleveheads recently to celebrate the opening of the renovated playing field beside the Methodist Chapel. Our thanks go to Chacewater Parish Council for providing the funds and to the ladies of the Chapel for providing refreshments. It was good to have Sarah Newton our local MP with us on that afternoon.

Regular meetings at County Hall have been taking place throughout the summer to try and set out approved planning for all the, so named, Langarth Development area, where the actual houses should be built, what size of house is required, number of bedrooms and even been looking at the size of gardens, all to make a balanced community, and then also what to do about the remaining farmland, because the whole site is spread along approximately two and a half miles of the A390. How many and where should any crossing places be installed across the dual carriageway to allow people to safely cross from Threemilestone? One thing is certain, with the weather being as it has been for the first half of August, the visitors to our coastline and beaches flock to Truro on wet days and add to

the congestion on the main road and also predicted is a large increase in the traffic through Shortlanesend of motorists trying to avoid the A390.

There is a planning situation in the “system” that has yet (at the time of writing this article) to be decided because it is for a non-food retail Shopping Centre. This causes me concern because of its impact on the centre of Threemilestone and in a wider sense the shopping facilities in our villages and the centre of Truro itself. Pedestrians from Threemilestone attempting to cross the dual carriageway without a safe light-controlled point, yes there is one to the Park and Ride Car Park but this is remote from the Retail Shopping area. I will try to continue to keep everyone informed and up to date in future editions of “What’s On”.

# Sarah Newton MP



*Need help or advice?*

**Sarah Newton, MP for Truro and Falmouth**, holds weekly surgeries around the constituency.

## Remembrance Week – Can You Help!

## VILLAGE PONDWATCH AUGUST 2019

Hot, dry weather, continuing into the last days of July, caused the pond's water level to drop dramatically. However, in the second week of August, enough rain came to stop the shrinkage and to restore at least two centimetres depth.

In the heat, a female mallard duck drops in to find shade; to graze and fossick among the weeds. Three swallows display great aerial agility as they dive to drink the water. Their flights follow a steep sine-wave path; sweep over the banked brambles, down to the surface, back up and wheel around, repeat and soar away across the surrounding grassland.

Vigorous growth of vegetation provides excellent habitat for many insects as well as roosts, food and forage for birds, around the pond. However, spreading blanket weed could overwhelm areas of open water and disrupt the surface film where many other creatures live and feed.

A plastic bottle trap was removed from the water. It held the drowned corpses of two Water Boatmen and an adult pair of Great Diving Beetles.

Wet and windy conditions do not favour flying insects, but bees, wasps and butterflies appear in good numbers to visit the abundant stands of blackberry, knapweed, purple loosestrife and white buddleia.

A Tree Bumble Bee, with his distinctive bright orange caped thorax, a furry black abdomen and white tail, searches under sycamore leaves. On a quiet

day, perhaps a dozen blue damselflies venture out and a trio of common red darter dragonflies is active.

Occasionally, a newt flickers to the surface in a patch of open water where whirligig beetles gyrate and glisten in the sunshine

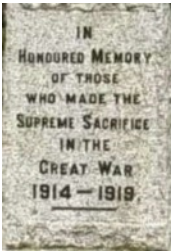

## IN MEMORIAM



Some 30 men of Chacewater lost their lives while serving in the armed forces during the First World War. Their graves lie in Africa, in Asia and across Europe. Many joined up locally or elsewhere in England. Others came back from Australia, from South Africa or North America.



Ongoing research uncovers more of the story behind the names of the fallen which are recorded on Chacewater War Memorial. While commemorating their individual sacrifice this also may make some contribution towards documenting part of our community's history. Paul Shevlin

## IN MEMORIAM

**Pte. Stanley H. LANYON** - King's Shropshire L.I. - 1<sup>st</sup>/1<sup>st</sup> Btn.  
**Hereford Regt. 04 September 1918.**

Stanley Herbert Lanyon was the second-youngest of 6 children raised by their mother, Susan, in Todpool – where she also grew up with her father, William Tregoning, a copper miner. The outbreak of the “Great War” came just 3 months before Stanley’s 16th birthday. His eldest brother, William Frederick, had left home at that age and joined the Royal Navy in November 1907. Another brother, 19 year old Frederick, joined the Army Veterinary Corps.

Precise details of Stanley Lanyon’s army service are sketchy. However, records show he was with the Gloucester Regiment Territorial Force (No. 36830) and in the King’s Shropshire Light Infantry (K.S.L.I.). It is most likely Stanley enlisted with the “Bantam” 14th Btn. of the Gloucester T.F. in 1916 (weeks before his brother Frederick was killed in action in northern Greece). He served with the Gloucesters in France and Flanders throughout 1917 until this unit was disbanded in a major re-structuring of army organisation in February 1918.

Pte. Lanyon was assigned to the King’s Shropshire Light Infantry (No: 29059) and was attached to the 1st/1st Battalion, Hereford Regiment. This was another volunteer Territorial Force unit, recently sent to France from Egypt. In July 1918, during the Battle of Soissons, they fought as part of the 102nd Brigade, 34th Division in the British 2nd Army XIX Corps. Alongside French and American

troops they re-captured most of the ground lost earlier that year to the German Spring Offensive.

Afterwards, they were moved north to the Ypres area and again stood next to the New Yorkers of the US National Guard 27th Division in the successful battle to capture the heights of Mt. Kemmel at the end of August. Pte. Stanley H. Lanyon was killed on 4th September 1918 as the troops moved further into Flanders. He is buried in the Wytchaete Military Cemetery, south of Ypres.

### **IN MEMORIAM**

**Pte. Frederick TREGONING - Duke of Cornwall's L.I., 8th Btn.  
12th Sept. 1918.**

Fred Tregoning joined the 10th Battalion of the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry (D.C.L.I.) when it was formed in 1915 by the Mayor and City of Truro. He was 20 years old and had worked as a miner for many years.

While the fresh battalion waited for its new equipment, Pte Fred Tregoning (No:24889) passed through the ranks of the regiment; training with the D.C.L.I. regular 2nd battalion and then moving to the 8th battalion. Both units sailed from Marseilles in November 1915 and arrived at the city of Salonika in northern Greece in December.

The 8th battalion D.C.L.I. remained in Macedonia for the rest of the war, as part of the 26th Infantry Division, where they confronted forces of the Central Powers on the Bulgarian border. Several attempts by the Allies to cross the frontier were held as Bulgarian troops defended positions near Doiran. While his battalion prepared for their final engagement before an armistice on 30th September ended the war in Macedonia, Fred Tregoning was killed in action on 12th September 1918.

Fred Tregoning's older brother, his father, grandfather (and probably his great grandfather) shared the same name of William Henry Tregoning. They were all miners. Both his father and his uncle Frederick were born at Pahuca in Mexico. Fred lived at Wheal Busy with his father. At Wheal Busy, Fred also shared the family home with his mother, Emily, sister Annie and younger brother Stanley. Uncle Frederick lived just down the road at Wheal Unity with his wife Elizabeth and their two children, Frederick and Rosina.

Fred's death in a faraway country would have been mourned by his extended family. He lies buried in the Karasouli Military Cemetery in northern Greece and is commemorated on the Chacewater War Memorial.

## Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) Monthly Update



The What's On readership will hopefully recall from the July edition that there would be a 2-month delay (*at least*) in moving **your Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)** to Referendum, which we now hope will take place in October. By way of a reminder, the reasons for this delay related to:

- An **Historic Environment (HE)** policy recommending removal of words stating that we would not want any heritage building/structure to be demolished for development. **Solution.** As this was not compliant with the Basic Conditions, we agreed with the Local Planning Authority (LPA) to amend our wording in the Introduction section of this policy area.
- Two policies relating to **Renewable Energy (RE)** – to do with Community Led Renewable Energy Development and Wind Turbine Development – had been recommended for removal. **Solutions.** We managed to work both policies back into the NDP and the wording actually looks much stronger now in terms of explanation.
- The last policy, for suggested removal linked directly to our wish - in terms of **Size and Scale of any single development - not to exceed 10 dwellings**. This, according to the Examiner, also failed to comply with the Basic Conditions or National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). **Solution.** We worked up some subtle yet important word amends, as follows:
  - **Original. Size and Scale.** Future developments should be small scale and any single development *limited to a maximum of 10 dwellings*.
  - **Revised. Size and Scale.** Future development should be small scale and any single development *should be no larger than up to and around 10 dwellings*.

So effectively (and quite frustratingly, given that these were the only real objections across 50 policies in a 89 page document) the net result was that we had to effectively go around the buoy in terms of repeating our statutory period of Public Consultation. So Final Drafts of your NDP have been deployed to:

- Chacewater Village Hall
- Blackwater Village Hall
- Twelveheads Sunday School
- The King's Head
- Our Fish and Chip Shop
- The Old Market

The period of consultation will hopefully have concluded on the 22<sup>nd</sup> August so, by the time you read this article and provided there are no further concerns, we should indeed meet that **October Referendum deadline**, at which we will:

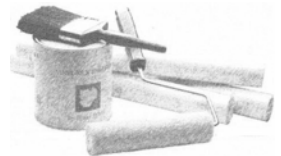

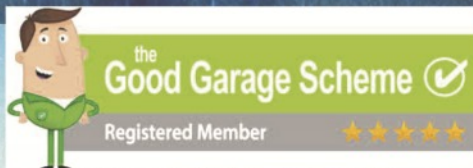
