

Kernow Microscopical Society

The next meeting of the Kernow Microscopical Society will be on Saturday February 24th in the Killifreth room at Chacewater Village Hall at 2.00pm.

Last month, some of our members talked about their current activities. One showed his (own designed and built) 360 degree rotating stage for viewing specimens under the stereo microscope; an extendable water sampler and a vacuum system for removing air bubbles from slides, along with some recently obtained books. Another described his investigation of a white blob in his fish tank which turned out to be very interesting moss animals (bryozoa). Finally, we explored an apothecary's case which a member had purchased and which contained a number of medical slides, one of which was labelled malaria, together with various bottles that either used to or did contain stains, there was a number of old labels and dissecting tools.

If you have read our proceedings with interest, do come along and talk to us about your interests and maybe discover a new hobby! You don't need to own a microscope, just have a yen to discover more about our microscopical world. Our meetings focus on the practical aspects of microscopy; using the microscopes and exploring methods of preparing specimen slides to view.

We are currently actively searching for new members and would be very happy to talk to you.

All together now.....

Wandering down to the shop in the village the other day, I got involved as usual in several protracted conversations, mostly about the weather. Nothing unusual there; it's the stuff of village life, but it got me thinking about community and what it means.

All our villages, and for that matter all our church communities, depend on people's individual willingness to join together, to offer their gifts in the service of their fellow human beings, and without this willingness there would be no village, no church, and in fact no society at all.

But the world we live in prizes individuality, and it often seems that what matters is achievement, money, status – all the things which divide people, set them against each other, make them compete, rather than bringing them together in mutual support and encouragement.

There is an African proverb which goes ‘I am because we are’. We find our identity, our place in the world, from those around us: we all of us fundamentally need each other.

And so it is with us. Christian life is about community: it is impossible to be a solo Christian. The Church, like the village, is not the buildings, it’s the people, all living and working together, and for it to work we need all the many and varied talents we can muster – and that’s talents for anything, however apparently small and irrelevant. We all, every single one of us, have a part to play, and what matters is that we are prepared to play it, to contribute, to join in and do our bit, and to support each other in doing that.

And of course, it follows from that that we must reach out, to everyone - to the lost, the unhappy and the deprived people in our midst. Our church family cannot exclude them: Christ taught us to reach out and welcome the stranger, and, if we are to live in imitation of him, that is what we are called to do.

So, in a society where it is becoming more and more difficult to get anyone to commit to anything, let us be counter-cultural, let us all make the effort to join in, to turn up for events and meetings, to reach out to strangers, to visit the people we know are lonely or sick. In fact, to offer all our gifts to the service of God and our fellow human beings.



JENNY'S GARDEN PATCH ~ FEBRUARY



After winter I expect you are all longing to be able to get out in your gardens again. The first of the early bulbs will be starting to push through the soil and with a bit of luck you may catch a glimpse of blue sky breaking the monotony of our usual winter grey. It's a month that brings hope to the garden, but where there is hope there is also some work and the more you can get done while things are comparatively quiet then the less you will have to do when things really kick off in March and April.

PLANT OF THE MONTH HEATHERS (ERICAS)



Heathers flowering in the middle of winter can bring much needed colour to the garden at this time of year. They are also important as ground-covering and foliage effect plants.

Unlike their summer-flowering counterparts, the winter flowering ericas are not too fussy about the type of soil they are planted in. They will live quite happily in alkaline (lime) soils, whereas the summer flowering types will only thrive in an acid soil.

The flower colours range from white through light pink, into deep pinks reds and cerise or purple. Foliage types are also important and can range from rich gold tinged with red, light yellow, silver and the normal range of greens and bronze/greens.

They should be pruned immediately after flowering. This can be carried out by lightly trimming with a pair of hedge shears. Simply cut back the flowered stems. This ensures compact bushy plants.

FEBRUARY IN THE GARDEN

- Continue planting bare-root trees, shrubs, roses and fruit bushes when weather allows
- Start to prune shrubs that have become too big or misshapen
- Start to hard prune late-flowering deciduous shrubs and clematis
- Begin pruning roses if weather allows
- Trim winter-flowering heathers
- Divide and replant snowdrops and aconites
- Cut back ornamental grasses
- Apply organic-based plant foods to established borders
- Continue digging over vegetable beds when weather allows
- Lime your vegetable beds if necessary
- Sow early vegetables under cover
- Chit seed potatoes
- Start preparing outdoor seed beds for early vegetables
- Start sowing bedding and annuals under cover
- Top dress shrubs grown in containers
- Continue to protect tender plants
- Start dahlias tubers into growth
- Prune over-wintered tender plants

Feed all fruit trees

Have a great month in the garden, there is plenty to do! Hopefully the weather will be kind to us but do not be lulled into a false sense of security by any mild spells. Sowing and planting too early can lead to disappointment if the weather turns cold again. VILLAGE PONDWATCH JANUARY 2018



The pond is very full after relentless rain.

The water is still, clear and dark. At the edges, mats of starwort spread bright green fingers

where the sunshine strikes the shores. The Bengal cat stalks behind the pond, his fur patterns echo decaying leaves where water lily pads have turned yellow-brown and sink beneath the surface.



There are few signs of midwinter. Bramble thickets are thinning but retain some leaves. For some hours on a cold morning the pond is covered by thin ice in large triangular plates. There's a glimpse of a pale grey tail turning in the starwort mat. Also a flash of silver as a beetle pushes through the weed. Lily pads lie sunken like sickly yellow moons at the shaded, eastern, end. In the sunny north-west the pads still float, smaller and purple.

Weak sunlight illumines patches of silt and leaf litter under a forest of weed and fringed water lily stalks. A small newt swims to the surface through sunlit water and then wriggles downwards in a shallow dive to disappear back into the weeds. Another newt may be seen as its underbelly flashes at the surface before it returns to the forest below.

In the dark depths, a little sliver of green catches the light as a caddis fly larva rolls its case slowly through the debris. A second larva has built a protective case almost entirely with shards of green plant material.

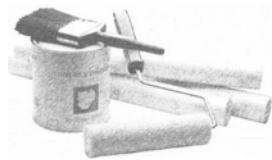

CHACEWATER RIGHTS OF WAY (CROW) WALK **SUNDAY 7TH JANUARY 2018**

A full 2 years on from the first of our Sunday morning rambles the Chacewater Rights of Way (CRoW) walking group appears to be as popular as ever. Our first walk of the New Year 2018 saw 20 members of our community (plus 8 of our 4-legged friends) met at the car park as usual at 9.30am, on what was quite a cold but very bright morning.

So, clad in that very British combination of winter clothing (woolly hats, cagoules, boots or wellies but also sunglasses!), we headed off towards Station Road and up west along the Terrace. Pausing for a moment at the foot of Wheal Busy Lane to observe the impact of the damp winter weather and how Cornwall Highways have recently dealt with the poor drainage issue just above Brookside. We then strolled up the Lane itself P.T.O.

(Public Right of Way (PRoW 301/63/1 to 3) which has almost developed its own tree lined canopy. With an obvious freshness in the air and sound of lambs all around, we passed Hillside Farm to the right and kept Arden Cottage and Primrose Farm to the left, before emerging out into the open and a truly fabulous view left towards Wheal Vor and beyond – just magnificent!

Following another short pause for our statutory group photograph, we transited down towards Salem Farm along a couple of short Bronze by-ways (PRoW 301/41/1 & 2) before emerging beside the main road opposite Salem Lodge. As the road was quite busy we took care crossing before trekking along and up the Silver bridleway (PRoW 301/55/1 & 301/54/1) towards Cox Hill; taking note of the magnificently restored chapel just before the entrance into Truro Tractors. With two route choices to take at this point, the call of a hot beverage was just too much, so we took off left down Cox Hill towards Thornleigh Cottage. At this point we darted off right and up along Gold bridleways

(PRoW 301/41/1 & 2) and taking the fork right along a couple more Gold by-ways (PRoW 301/50/2 & 1) before coming out on Church Hill near the wall that is Chacewater House.

Once again taking note of the damage resulting from Storm Eleanor (broken branches, blocked drains, etc.) we arrived back at the main car park exactly 1 hour and 30 minutes after our departure. A terrific introduction to the 2018 walking schedule for both young and not so, there was good chat, several dogs got a bit of a surprise from walking through a few ice-covered water pools and we all felt better for the exercise.
