JENNY'S GARDEN PATCH ~ MARCH



Two months of the year have passed by already and the days are getting longer. It is lovely to feel a little more strength in the sun. The first signs of spring are arriving, but beware, don't let your enthusiasm run away on mild days. Frosts will still be lurking around, it is better to delay sowing and planting if the soil is too wet and cold.

PLANT OF THE MONTH CHOISYA

Choisya is a small genus of aromatic evergreen shrubs in the rue family, Rutaceae. Members of the genus are commonly known as Mexican orange or mock orange due to the similarity of their flowers with those of the closely related orange, both in shape and scent. They are native to southern North America, from Arizona, New Mexico.




In mild gardens it will reach full size in the open, but elsewhere plants benefit if sheltered from the cold winds that can damage the foliage and restrict growth - a warm wall is ideal, or plants may be grown in containers that can be moved under cover in winter. The bushes look attractive at all times, but especially when covered with the very fragrant white blooms shorten stems by 25-30cm (10-12in) after flower to encourage a second flush in autumn.

MARCH IN THE GARDEN

- Apply plant foods to established borders
- Mulch bare soil
- Continue to prune overgrown and late-flowering shrubs
- Continue pruning roses
- Cut back perennials and grasses that were left over winter
- Divide overgrown clumps of perennials
- Dead-head daffodils
- Plant summer-flowering bulbs
- Sow hardy annuals out of doors
- Continue sowing bedding under cover
- Sow vegetables in prepared beds out of doors
- Protect fruit blossom from late frosts
- Treat moss on lawns
- Re-seed bare patches on lawns
- Start repotting houseplants
- Check pond pumps and get them running.
- Make sure the birds have plenty of food and fresh water

I hope you have a good month in your gardens, there is plenty to be getting on with. If you require any further horticultural advice please come along to Chacewater Garden Centre and have a chat with any of the helpful and friendly staff..

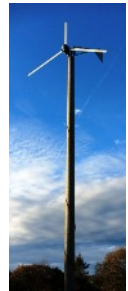

Chacewater Rights of Way Walking Group

During a very wet January, many Byways and Bridleways were waterlogged and flooded in some places. Footpaths became extremely muddy. However, on Sunday 4th February the CRoW walking group enjoyed sunshine and clear skies. Once again, 20 walkers plus 8 dogs headed out on a westerly route promising firmer ground under foot. Leaving the Square, we turned immediately up Jakes' Lane (Byway 301/68/1) noting the Old Print Shop on the left, opposite access to the former Royal Mail sorting office. Along Falmouth Road, the Bowling Club's brand new fence was admired as we passed by neighbouring *Carn Tagree* and *Gwitha Gwir* – two of the oldest and the newest dwellings in Chacewater.

Safely across High Street – not so much traffic on Sunday morning – we followed Bakehouse Lane (Byway 75/1) around the back of the recently renovated *Rambling Miner* cottages. Pausing on the bridge at Sergeants Hill we could see the

Leat running smoothly in a good clear channel. Then, via the Terrace, we headed west on Wheal Busy Lane (Byway 63/1) with broad views across the valley and out towards Carn Brae. After dodging puddles we came (by Footpath 5/2) to Wheal Busy and another opportunity to ponder the future of the Old Forge and to view cast iron lintels of the *Great Wheal Busy Mines* set over its doorways.

We could have gone straight on the Bridleway (61/2) past *Pitslewren Farm*. Unfortunately, connecting Bridleway (61/1) was impassable as a 25 metre-long section lay deep under standing water. So, we turned right and went a short way up the lane before turning west again onto a wide, well-kept route (cobbled with white quartz) over the downs, past *Boscawen Farm* and on to Hallenbeagle (Bridleways 60/1 & 60/2, joining Byways 2/4, 2/3 & 2/2). Here we turned south on the level, metalled road (Byway 1/3, 1/4) reaching *Fay's Camping Park* on Bridleway (1/10). Following the bridleway (1/9 & 1/5) we passed Wheal Busy allotments, returned to the Old Forge and then re-traced our route east on Wheal Busy Lane (63/1) onto The Terrace and Station Road, arriving back at the Car Park by 11.15am.

Join the next walk on Sunday 4th March. All very Welcome. Meet at 9.30am in the Car Park.

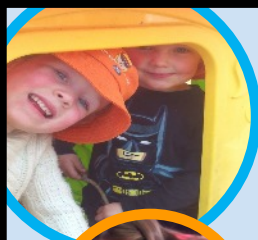

Local Government News.

Dear Reader

It is always good to start off the article with topical news for Chacewater and I am pleased to be able to do just that. There has been an in depth look at the Cornwall Electoral Divisions throughout the entire county and last week, as I write, at the full Cornwall Council meeting councillors voted with a clear majority to accept the Boundary Commissions recommendations for Cornwall, as from May 2021, to have 87 elected members, which works out at approximately 5,000 electors per Council member. The good news for Chacewater Parish is that, although in the

early stages there was a proposal to include in the Kea Electoral Ward the villagers from Twelveheads, this on further consideration was rejected and I am pleased to say that the agreed recommendation is that Twelveheads will remain within Chacewater which ensures better representation as they are also part of Chacewater Parish. I know that the residents of Twelveheads welcome this decision. Having now decided upon the Cornwall Council Electoral Wards, the next stage will be to look at Parish boundaries.

A recommendation has now been granted, to convert the former Stamps Engine House near the Wheal Busy Cross Roads and make it into a dwelling. There are many conditions associated with this permission concerning the finish of the building as it must reflect its former life and not become too domesticated looking. This will ensure that part of Chacewater's heritage is preserved and not allowed to fall into a ruin.

I am pleased to report that the caravan installed over the Christmas period near the Wheal Busy Crossroads without planning permission is being investigated by Cornwall Council's Enforcement Department.

There has been an issue with a reoccurrence of blocked drains along The Terrace which is the result of heavy rain fall washing debris down the Wheal Busy Lane despite Cormac previously clearing them. I have asked Mr Richard Northey to look at the scene and see if he can help, but we have had an exceptionally wet winter and the heavy bursts of rain bring down all manner of earth, leaves etc

Finally, we would like to congratulate Chacewater Players for their recent performance of the Pantomime Sleeping Beauty. I would not single out any one particular cast member but congratulate them all on another memorable evening full of fun, colour and entertainment. Our only disappointment, on the night that we attended, was that the audience was rather sparse. We are so fortunate to have this group of

VILLAGE PONDWATCH – FEBRUARY 2018



Icy Pond – Feb 2018

There are some signs of Spring-time. On the bank, Lesser Celandines have yellow flowers and new leaf buds are showing on bare bramble branches. However, in early February, a series of heavy hailstorms topped-up the pond with icy water. Toads and frogs remain under cover; no doubt they will come out in March.

Meanwhile, the pond water is crystal clear. Sunlight flickers through green leaves and stalks of oxygenating weed. Caddis fly larvae may be seen as they tumble very slowly through the silt. Their tubular cases (about 20mm long) are mostly brown and blend with the muddy bottom debris. Sometimes, a pale piece of stalk on an individual case stands out like a grain of rice moving among the leaves.

Occasionally, the sparkling water surface shivers when a light squall of wind sends across patterns of circles, darts and ripples. Newts are quite active. Dark heads and backs generally camouflage their lunges to the surface. One flashes a black-spotted orange belly. Usually, they are seen when they turn and reveal pale undersides and wriggling tails as they dive. Clear water allows the newt's progress to be watched until it disappears deeper into the weed stems.

On the bank again, a rabbit shelters beneath the Village Hall ramp before sprinting across the Millennium Green, past the pond's southern edge, back to its burrow.

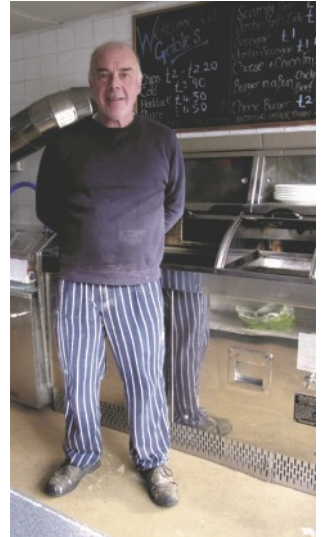

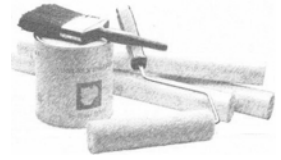

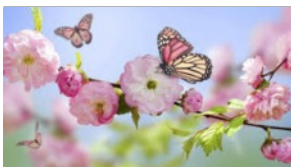
