Swallow.

Swallows are small birds with dark, glossy-blue backs, red throats, pale underparts and long tail streamers. They are extremely agile in flight and spend most of their time on the wing. They are widespread breeding birds in the Northern Hemisphere, migrating south in winter.

Swallow numbers in the UK have fluctuated over the last 30 years with pronounced regional variation in trends.

You know autumn is coming when swallows start to form flocks on overhead wires, especially at migration points like Penwith and The Lizard. They may have nested three times if it has been a good summer and some young will only just have left the nest. They may not leave for weeks but they are feeding up for the huge journey to South Africa.

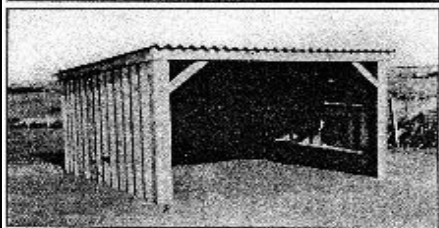

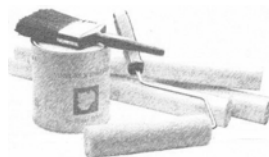

JENNY'S GARDEN PATCH ~ SEPTEMBER



Another month has flown by and Autumn is just around the corner. Hopefully your gardens are still looking good and the food crops are coming in thick and fast. September is a busy month with plenty of jobs that need doing, gathering in your crops, tidying up and new plantings

PLANT OF THE MONTH DAFFODIL

Daffodil, also known as narcissus and jonquil, is a type of flowering plant that belongs to the Amaryllis family. Grown in masses they are a delightful sight, and with colours ranging from white and yellow through to pink, there's a daffodil for every garden.



Daffodils are normally available from mid August onward, and are best planted at that time, but planting can be extended right through to end of October. Even if planted in November, they will not disappoint in the following spring.

The most important thing when planting daffodils is to plant them at the correct depth. As a basic guide the depth want to be 3 times the length of the bulb e.g. if the bulb is 2 inches, they should be planted at a depth of 6 inches. However, it is better to err on the

side of planting more deeply. Planting them more deeply makes it less likely they will dry out.

SEPTEMBER IN THE GARDEN

- Buy or make a compost bin to take autumn debris.
- Plant new perennials.
- Remove spent summer annuals and replace with spring bedding such as wallflowers and forget-me-nots.
- Plant spring-flowering bulbs in beds, borders, pots and grass.
- Plant prepared bulbs for indoor flowering around Christmas
- Sow hardy annuals, such as marigolds, centaurea and California poppies.
- Begin moving tender plants into sheltered positions or into the greenhouse or conservatory.
- Carry out autumn lawn maintenance, including aerating, scarifying, top dressing and feeding. Reseed bare patches, and create new lawn from seed.
- Plant garlic, winter lettuce, turnips, spring cabbages and autumn onion sets in the vegetable garden.
- Prune climbing roses when they've finished flowering, removing dead, damaged and diseased stems.
- Lift and divide congested clumps of herbaceous perennials..
- Cut back the canes on summer-fruiting raspberries

Have a great month in your gardens, we might even be lucky and have an Indian Summer. If you would like any further information come along to Chacewater Garden Centre and have a chat with any of the helpful and friendly staff.

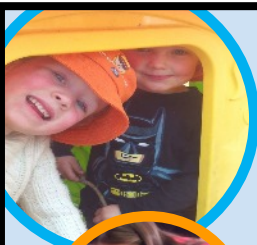

Local Government News.

Dear Reader

Mid-August and once again it is time of the year to tidy up the spring and early summer growth and I am very grateful that the Parish Council gave their financial support to Mr Richard Northey for cutting back the grass and brambles that were growing almost across the path that leads from "The Shute" to the Kerley Vale Estate. Thank you Richie for your help there and in other places in the Parish.

In the same area we had a lockable box broken into, that was fixed to the drainage pipe in the swampy area off the bridge from the car park, and we were worried that it might have contained electrical equipment that would be dangerous if children played with it. So, I contacted South West Water who checked the situation for safety and repaired the lock, our thanks to them for their prompt attention to the matter. To complete that area it will soon be time to cut back all the growth around "The Shute" but it would be best to leave it until the summer growth is over so that it will remain tidy for the winter.

I hope that nobody was caught out with Church Hill being closed by day, this week, as I write to avoid any danger whilst the Forestry team felled the old Monterey Pine Trees in the Recreation Ground. I know many were very sorry to see them cut down but as most people were aware, because of their age, these trees had become dangerous and we were advised to have them taken down professionally on health and safety grounds.

There has been around the Parish recently some incidences of "fly tipping" so if any of you see this activity going on please report it to the Parish Clerk or any Parish Councillor so the matter can be dealt with. Obtaining a registration number would also be helpful as this could lead Cornwall Council prosecuting the culprit as the collection of this rubbish adds a further burden on our council tax.

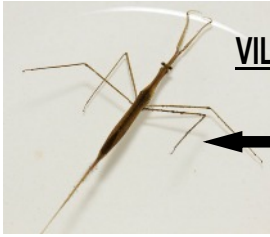

Welcome to New Parish Councillor

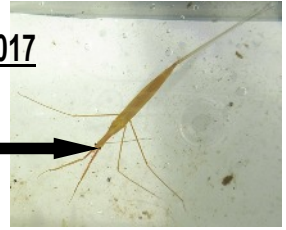
Chacewater Parish Council welcomed another new addition to the Council at the last meeting.

VILLAGE PONDWATCH – AUGUST 2017



Water Stick Insect
Ranatra linearis



Regular rainfall has kept the pond full and the water clear. A backswimmer beetle rows steadily under water and causes ripples as it pops up suddenly. Dozens of small whirligig beetles continually move around the surface while, rarely now, a newt is seen swimming below.

In contrast, two or three straw-coloured Water Stick Insects may be seen quite often moving very slowly in the water. Head down at a 30° angle, at first, they resemble bits of drifting dried grass. However, in the open water usually they move forward by “walking” with long thin legs. A fine breathing tail reaches the surface and hooked front legs project before their round black eyes. The creatures are about 6cm long overall, but they’re well camouflaged when they get to the weeds.

Tall stands of purple loosestrife surround the pond and tiny windblown petals drift on the glossy water like cerise sprinkles. Half of the pond’s surface area is covered with a mosaic of fringed waterlily leaves in many shades of green, yellow and brown. When the wind drops, Blue damselflies drift quietly along the edges and many Red Darter dragonflies hover above, then jink and jostle wildly for airspace. In the warm afternoon they fly in mated pairs as the brown females dip to lay eggs in the lily pads.

In the sunshine, big blackberries ripen as wasps and hoverflies roam among the bramble leaves. Clumps of common knapweed attract many insects to forage on their purple flower heads. Red

tailed bumble bees – both males and female workers are quite easy to identify. It is harder to be sure what kind of carder bee and white tailed bumble bee is visiting.

Royal Oak for Diamond Jubilee

As has been reported before, Chacewater Parish was presented with an Oak Tree from one of the Royal Palaces to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II.

It was a mere twig when it arrived in 2012 and was nurtured for years by Roy Bailey until it was big enough to be planted in the Millennium Green. It is now thriving and has a protective enclosure to prevent it being damaged when cutting the grass.

Now Chacewater Parish Council has provided a plaque so that its origins will be remembered for many years. Oaks, of course can live at least 200 years and some are known to have lived for 400 years. Redruth Old Cornwall Society

Friday September 8th 2017: 'History of Penzance, Newlyn & Penlee Lifeboats';

The rich heritage of the first lifeboat station in Cornwall, 1803 to the present. **Martin Brockman** tells this remarkable story of bravery and sacrifice.
